




Grade IX conducted morning assembly from 7th December to 11th December on the topic "Life Is Fun". The assembly began with the prayer followed by the




Prayers of thanks and special thanksgiving ceremonies are common among almost all religions after harvests and at other times being thankful is just one of the important factors behind the harvest.

#### Special Assembly Presentation on Kisan Diwas by Grade II B


Farmers are definitely the backbone of society; they are the magician who produce money from the mud. India has been predominantly an agricultural country & agriculture is the main source of India's economic development.

"Ethics and equity and the principles of justice do not change with the calendar" By D. H Lawrence.






