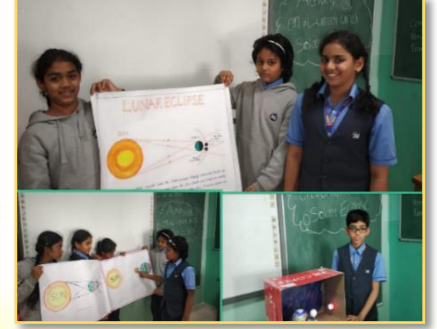
Students of grade IV performed an activity on the postal services and importance of communication through letters.

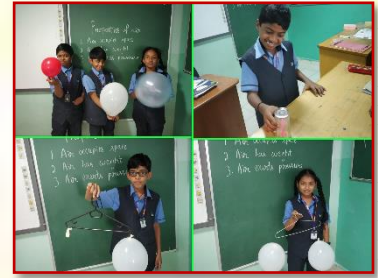

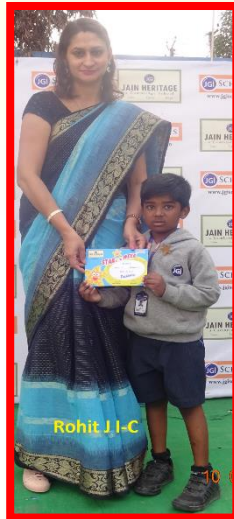

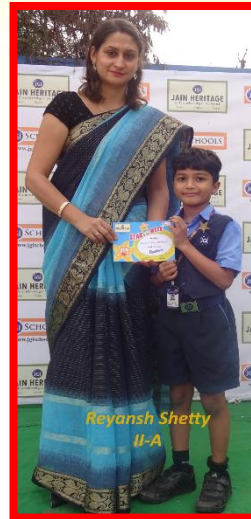

### KHANDAGIRI AND UDAYGIRI CAVES

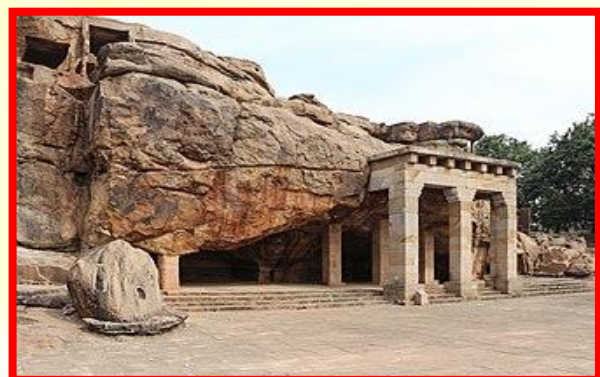
The twin hills of Khandagiri and Udayagiri contains excavated rock cut caves called Lena and they are the dwelling retreats of the Jaina (Jain) Ascetics. There are 18 caves in Udayagiri and 15 caves in Khandagiri. These caves were excavated by King Kharavela and his successors in 1<sup>st</sup> century B.C.

Most of the caves consisted a row of cells which open directly to the verandahs. The cells are mostly dormitories with sloping rise of the floor at the rear end to serve the purpose of a pillow. In later periods some of the cells were converted to shrines with minor alterations, such as increasing the height of chamber by digging the floor to a deeper depth. The doorways of the cells has pilasters on either side with crowning animal figures and arches over them.

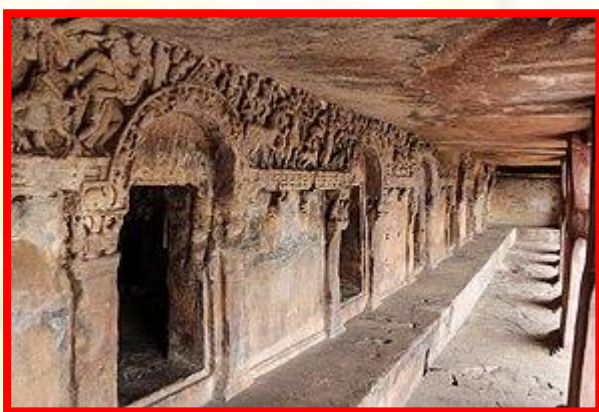
Among all the caves Rani Gupha (Queen's cave) and Swargapuri – Manchapuri caves are double storied Monastries. The famous inscriptions of King Kharavela is found engraved on the brows of Hathi Gupha (Elephant's cave). They are written in Brahmi script in 17 lines. It records many of his expeditions including victory over the Magadha Empire and retrieval of the Jaina Cult Image taken over by the Nanda Kings. The depiction of 24 Tirthankaras in various caves in the Ananta gupha, Ganesha gupha, Jaya Vijaya gupha and Mancapuri gupha, are noteworthy achievements in early Indian Art.



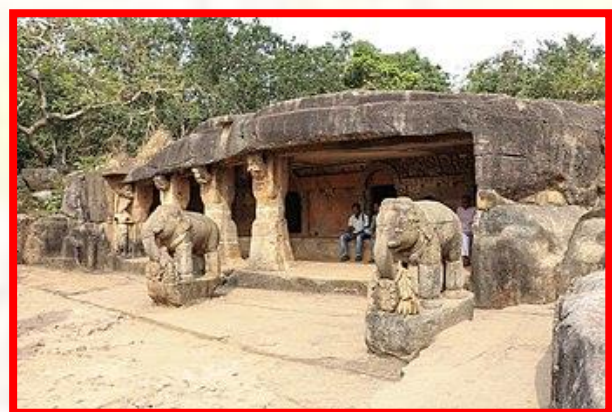

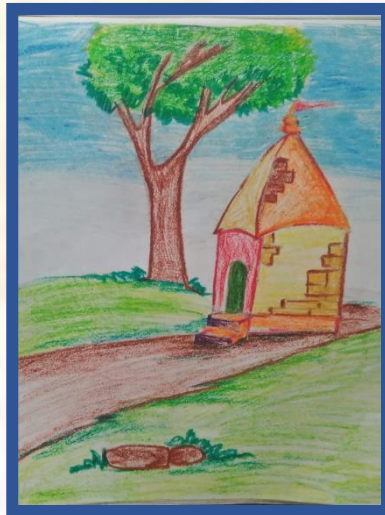
