queries of the students.


Students of grade VI celebrated this day as an attempt to emphasize the value of doctors in our lives and to offer them our respect by commemorating one of their greatest representative.

### Topic: "Health is Wealth"




## Special Assembly Presentation on “Guru Poornima” by Grade I



## Assembly Presentation by Grade VII


### Topic: "Stranger Danger"

## Hindi and Telugu Poem Recitation Activity for Grade IV




मेरी मातृभाषा मेरी पहचान, जो बनाती है जीवन महान

# Bonalu Celebration


"Bonalu is a festival which symbolizes the blend of gaiety and culture."


The activity aimed to promote creativity and build self-confidence among students.

### Topic: “Appreciating Others”


“Appreciation is a wonderful thing. It makes what is excellent in others belong to us as well.”- By Voltaire.

### Topic: “Appreciating Others”




“Appreciation can make a day, even change a life. Your willingness to put into words is all that is necessary.”

## Shloka Recitation Competition for Grade VII and VIII






# Special Assembly Presentation on “World Nature Conservation Day” by Grade VIII
