
> **Special Assembly Presentation on** "Gandhi - The Legend" by Grade V



It starts on the day of Mahalaya Amavasya and the 9-day festivities will culminate on "Saddula Bathukamma" or "Pedda Bathukamma" festival on Ashwayuja Navami, popularly known as Durgashtami which is two days before Dussehra. Bathukamma festival indicates the beginning of Sarad or Sharath Ruthu. Anchoring was done by Sritej who turned out to be a great anchor. Pledge was administered by Hari. Jeevana Shruthi enlightened us with a new thought. Words were told by Reyansh. An inspiring article on the importance of Bathukamma, the medicinal values of flowers used in Bathukamma, and about naivedyas for 9 days was spoken by Amrutha, Sumanjali, Kusuma Kruthika, Moksha, and Ruthvika. We enjoy the beautiful rhythmic Bathukamma song by Veda. The assembly concluded with a message on the importance of Bathukamma. Bathukamma represents the cultural spirit of Telangana. In Telugu, 'Bathukamma' means 'Mother Goddess come Alive' and Goddess Maha Gauri - 'Life Giver' is worshipped in the form of Bathukamma – the patron goddess of womanhood, Gauri Devi.

Assembly Presentation by Grade VI Topic: "Smile – A Universal Language"


