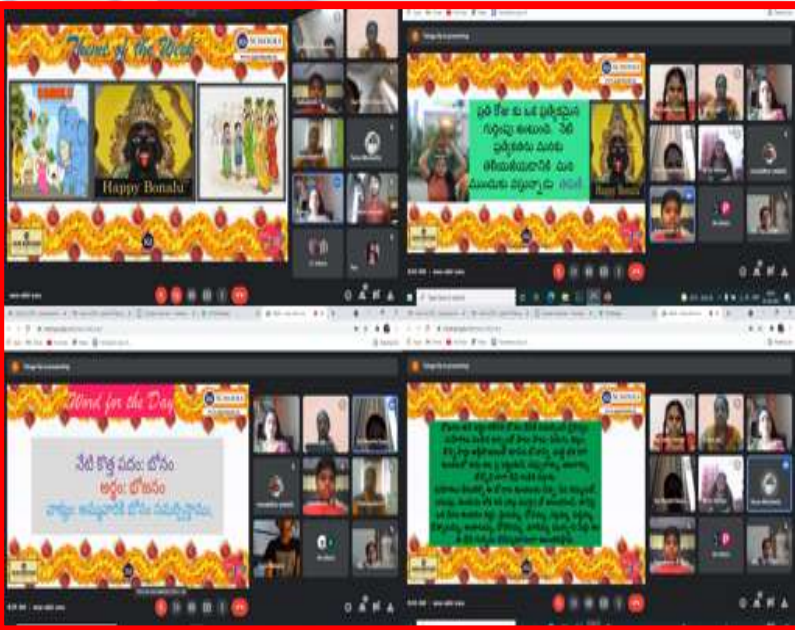

Special Assembly Presentation on Bonalu Celebration by Grade VII



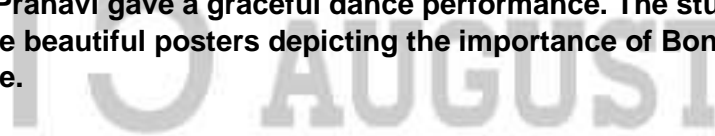
“Bonalu is a festival which symbolizes the blend of gaiety and culture.”

The vibrant and unique folk festival ‘Bonalu’, reflecting the Telangana culture was celebrated by the students of grade VII, in the morning assembly on 3rd of August 2021. The word “Bonam” is a contraction of the word Bhojanam which means a meal or a feast in Telugu, and it is an offering to Mother Goddess. Women prepare rice cooked with milk and jaggery in a new brass or earthen pot adorned with neem leaves, turmeric, vermilion, and a lit lamp on the top of the pot. At this time the people are encouraged to take bath with turmeric and neem leaves, and plant neem trees on the outskirts, as neem plants have medicinal properties. Neem leaves help avoid the plagues or epidemics which normally spread in the rainy season.

Assembly Presentation by Grade III Topic: The Art of Perseverance- Keep Going!

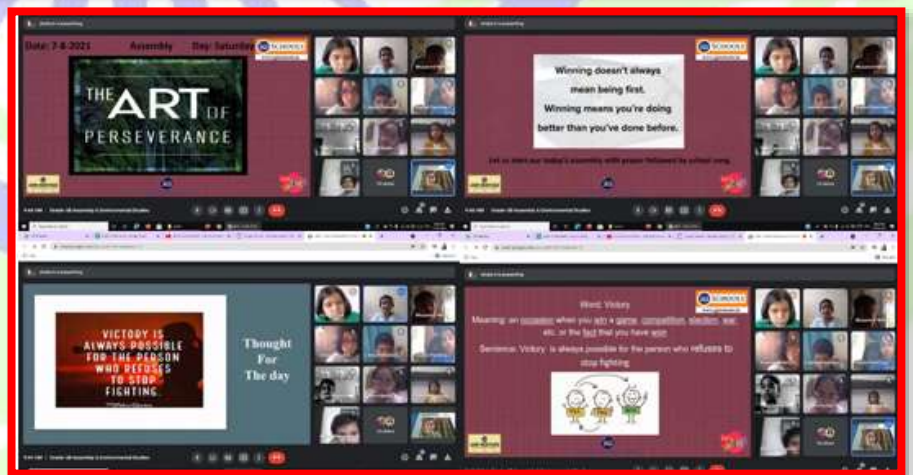
“Perseverance is failing 19 times than succeeding the 20th time”

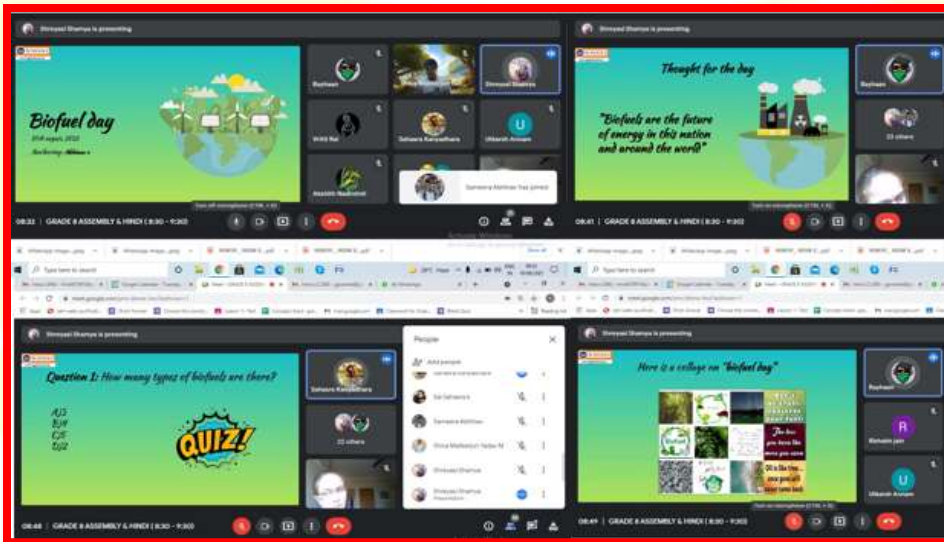

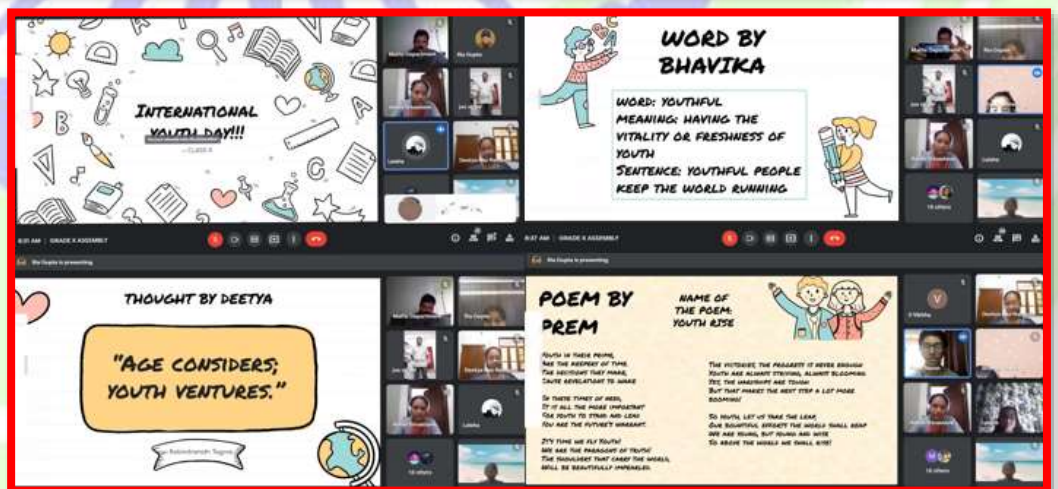

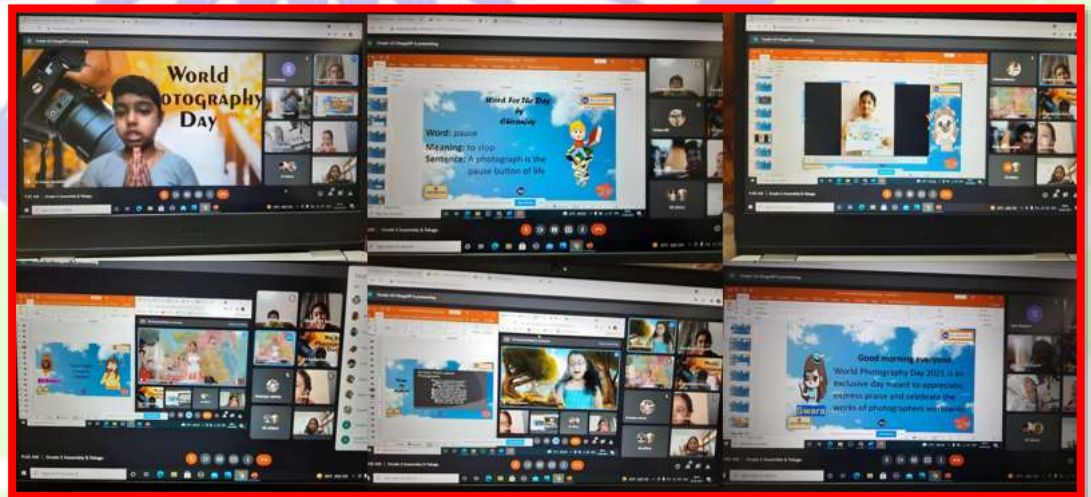
The heart and mind are the true lenses of the camera.

To mark World Photography Day, we the students of Grade II conducted a special assembly on 18.08.2021.

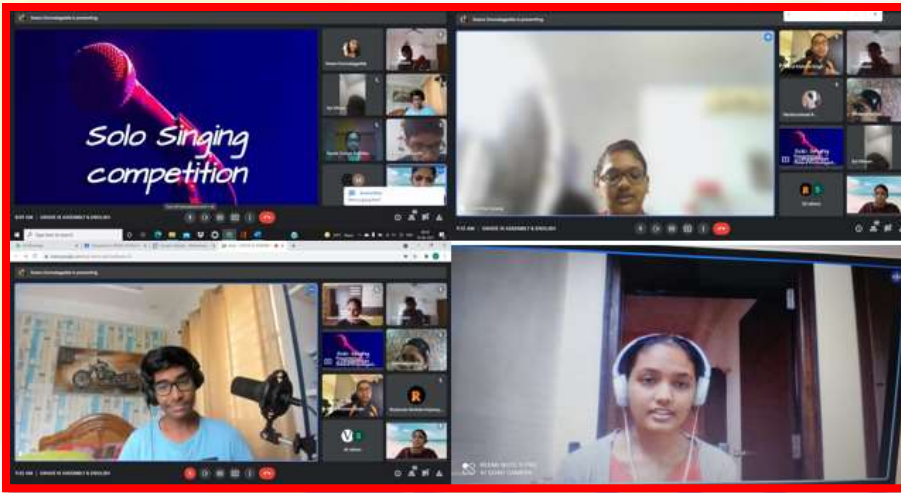

Patriotic Singing Competition



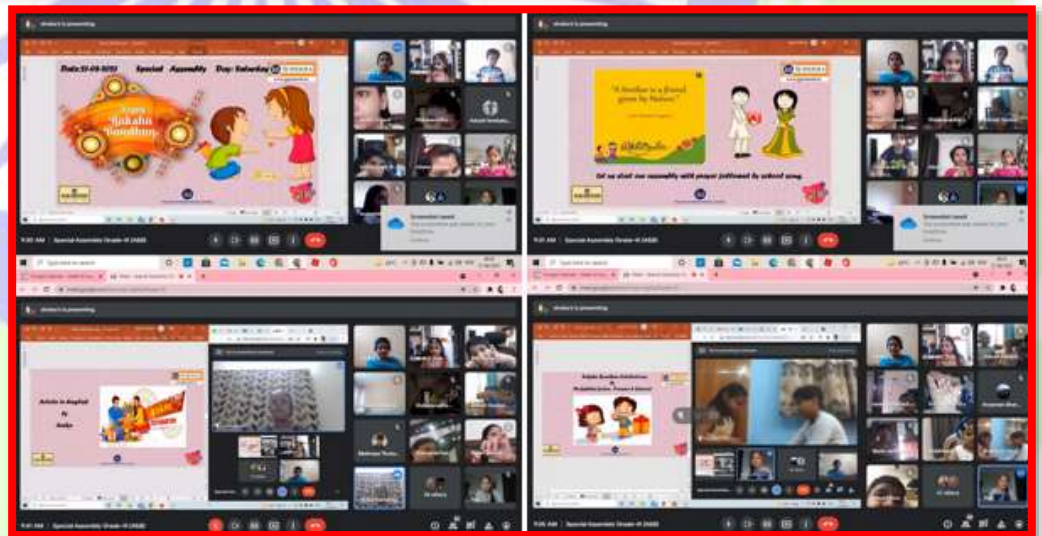
“Dil diya hai jaan bhi denge

The students of Grade-III conducted the morning assembly on the topic “Raksha Bandhan” on 21st August 2021.

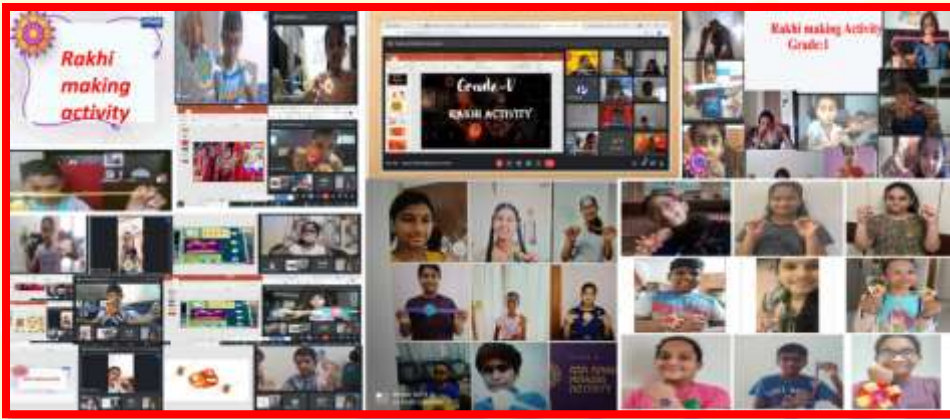

Assembly Presentation by Grade V Topic: Good Manners and Good etiquette

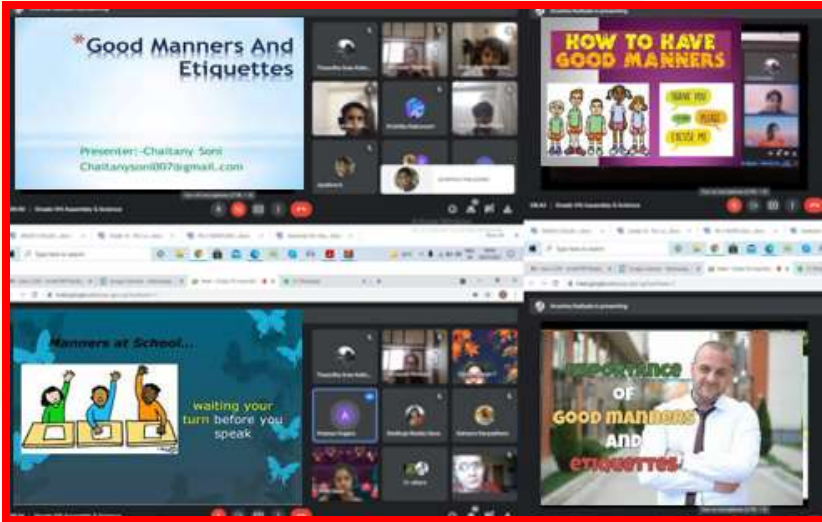

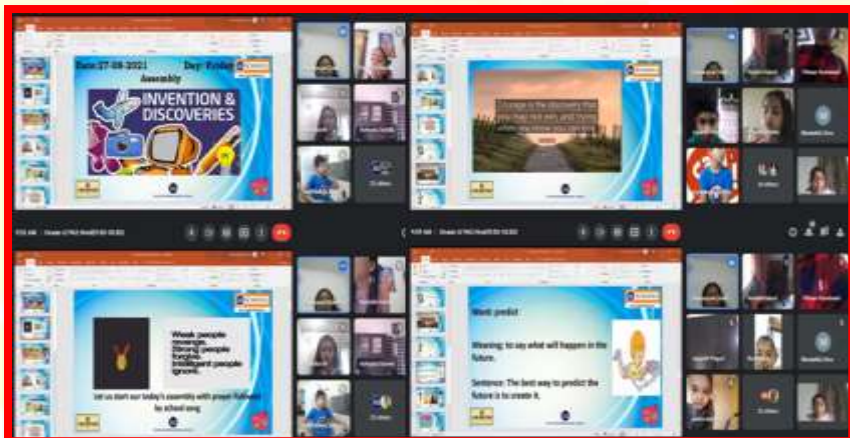

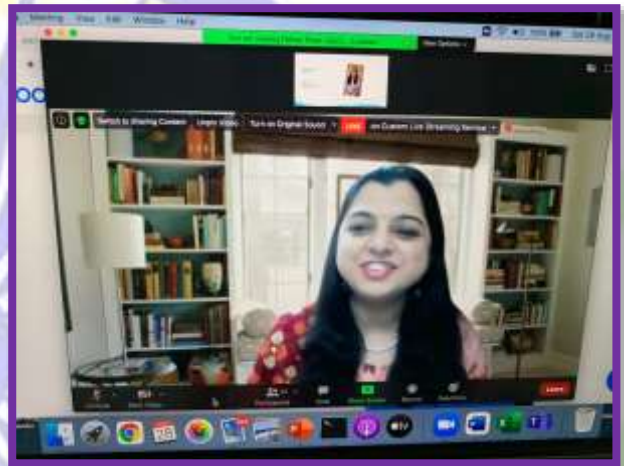
