



Overall, it was an excellent assembly that made students positive & productive.







Assembly Presentation by Grade I Topic: Caring for Our Wildlife



Wildlife traditionally refers to undomesticated animal species but has come to include all




organisms that grow or live wild in an area without being introduced by humans. Different days of the week were allotted to each student to speak about Caring for Our Wildlife in the assembly.

The assembly was a knowledge imparting one, as students gained an understanding about the problems our wildlife is facing and how to tackle these problems by being considerate of our Wildlife.





Central Excise Day is celebrated every year on 24th February in order to commemorate the enactment of the Central Excise Act 1944 by the Central Government. Central Excise Day celebration encourages the staff members of various excise departments across the nation to perform the duty with full sincerity in order to prevent the corruption in goods manufacturing business. The said law was also made on the very same day. Excise duty is a form of tax imposed on goods for their production, licensing and sale. Today, excise duty applies only on petroleum and

liquor. Excise duty was levied on manufactured goods and levied at the time of removal of goods, while GST is levied on the supply of goods and services. Typical examples of excise duties are taxes on gasoline and other fuels and taxes on tobacco and alcohol (sometimes referred to as sin tax). The following are the features of the excise duty are Imposition, Nature, Basis of Taxation, Payment, Scope, Maintenance of Records, Excise Rate, Administrations etc.

The students of Grade VII conducted a special assembly on the topic, "Central Excise Day" on the 24th of February, 2021. The students elaborated the importance and necessity of Excise Tax to be implemented at various levels in the society through valuable articles, poems, and thoughts. 

Together, the two had three children. Susanna, and a pair of twins, Hamnet and Judith. Shakespeare wrote many renowned plays like; Romeo and Juliet, Hamlet, Othello, and The Tempest. To this day, people still re-enact these plays. First



seen to the public in 1597, Romeo and Juliet are actually an adaptation of a poem, previously written by another author. People believe that the play was written between the time period of 1591 and 1595. Macbeth is another tragedy written by Shakespeare to be a play. It was first performed in 1606, being first published in the year 1632, after the death of the author. In the theatre, Macbeth was often associated with a curse. Instead of calling it by its actual name, people called it "The Scottish Play,". Scottish because in the play, Macbeth was Scottish. To summarize, Shakespeare was an extraordinary person. He is often called the English national poet and considered by many to be the greatest dramatist of all time. He occupies a unique position in world literature. The students of Grade VII conducted the morning assembly from the 22nd of February to the 26th of February on the topic, "Shakespeare and his World." The entire week was illuminated by praying to the almighty followed by the school song. The pupils presented various articles on Shakespeare, poems from his writings and plays. 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
