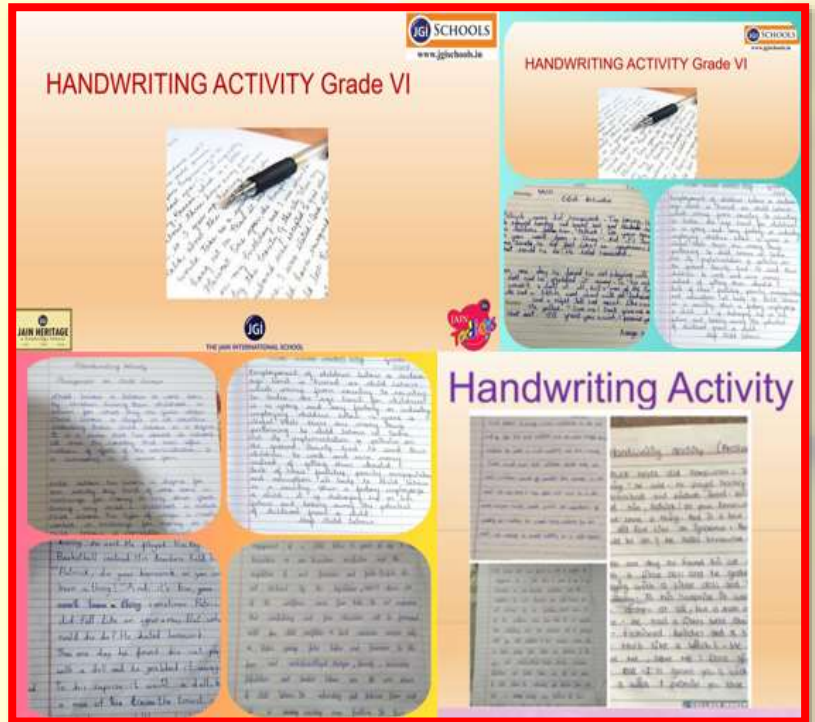

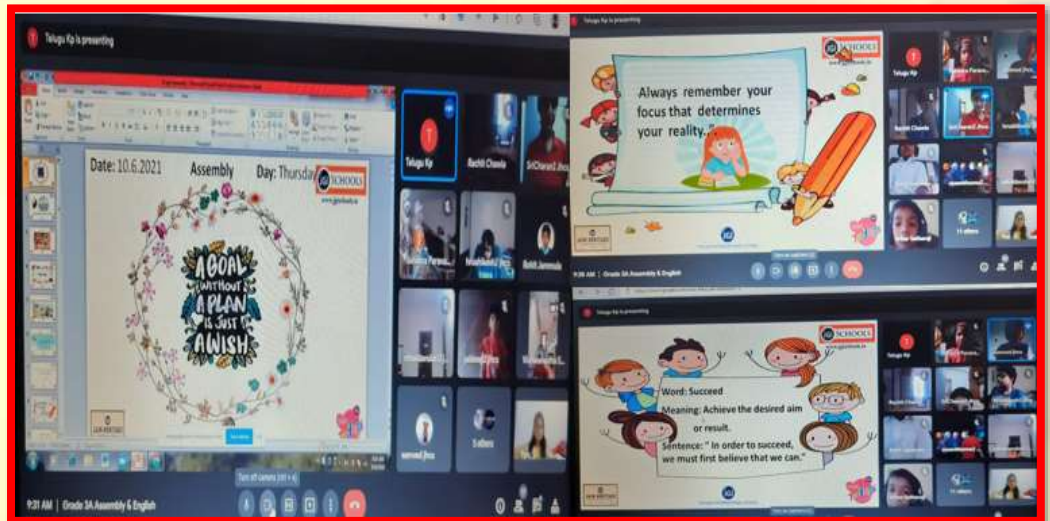

Special Assembly Presentation on World Father’s Day by Grade II

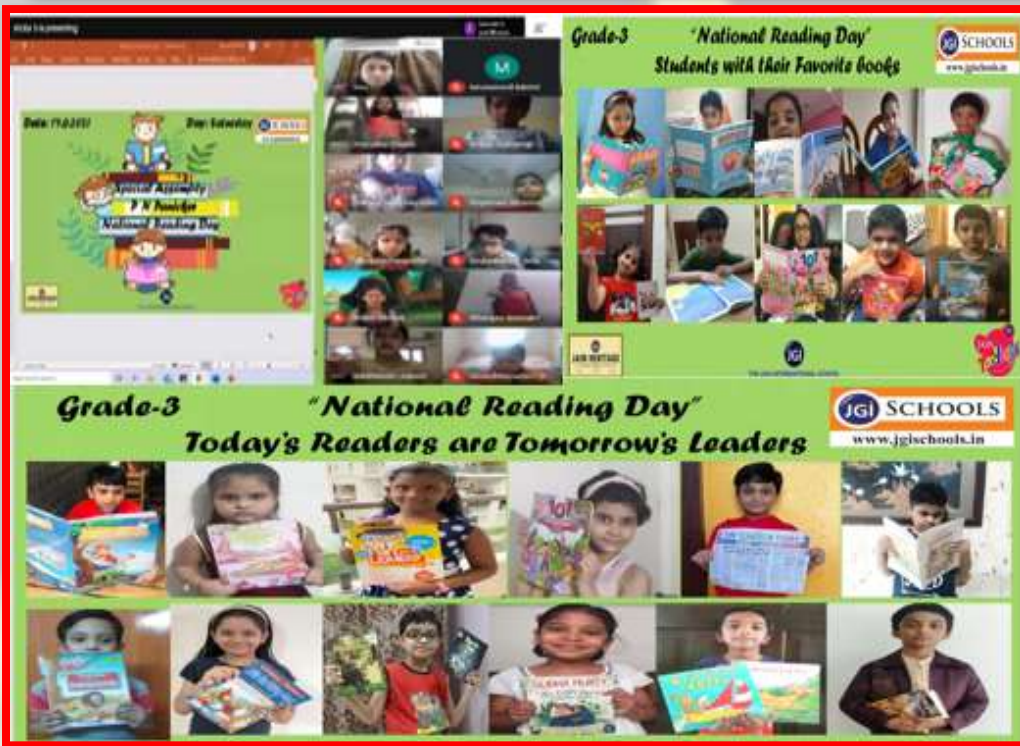
It’s Father’s Day,

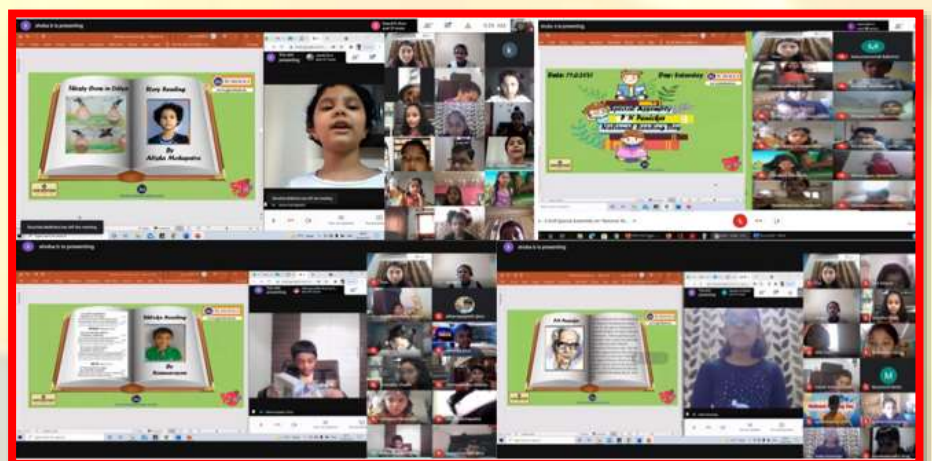

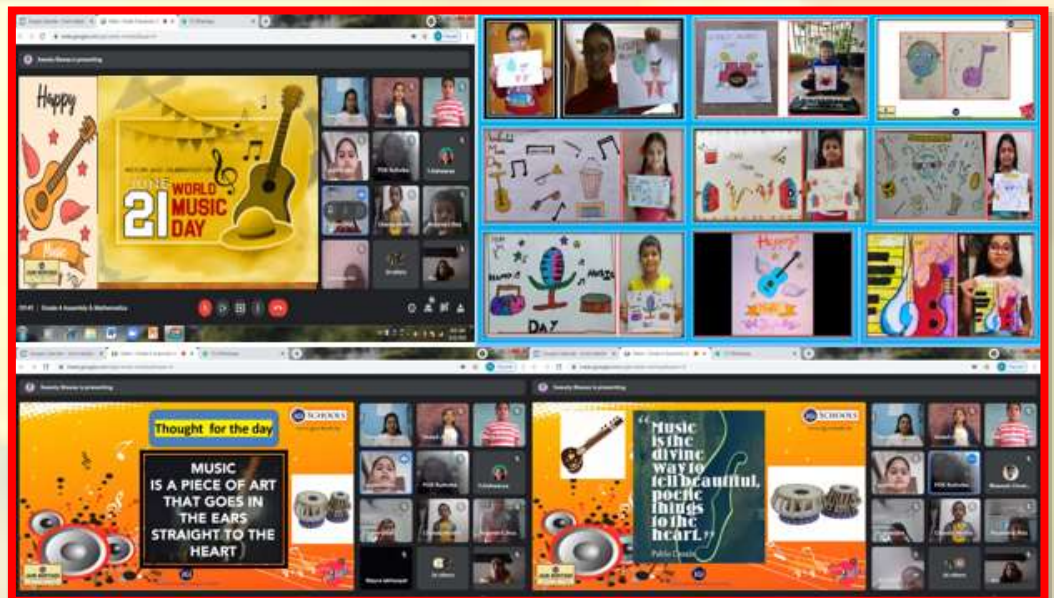
Special Assembly Presentation on World Music Day by Grade IV

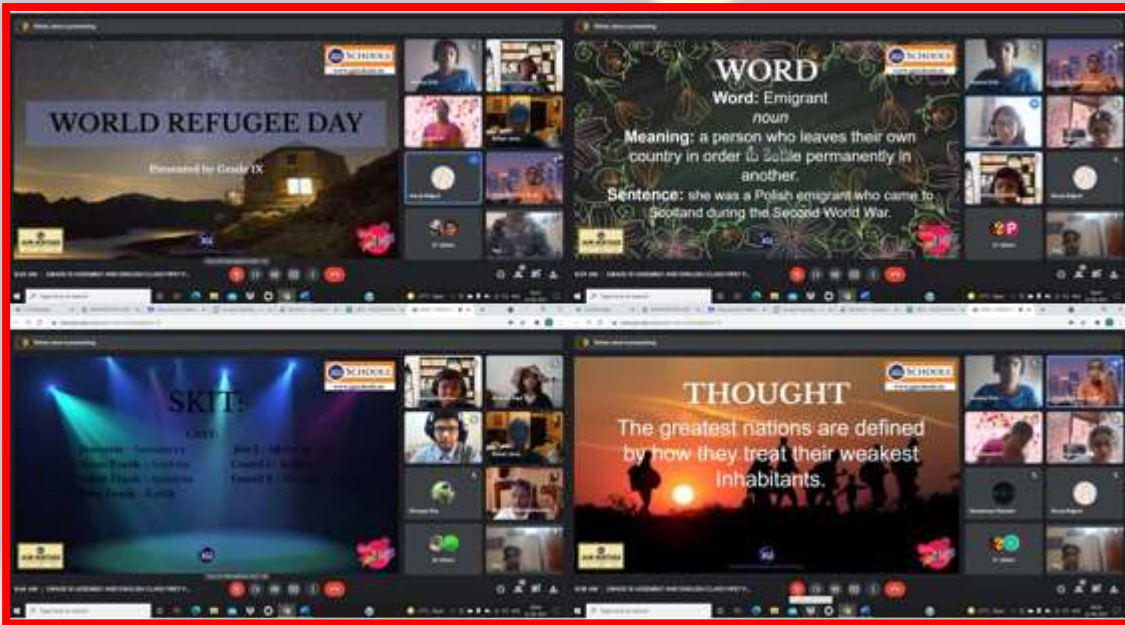

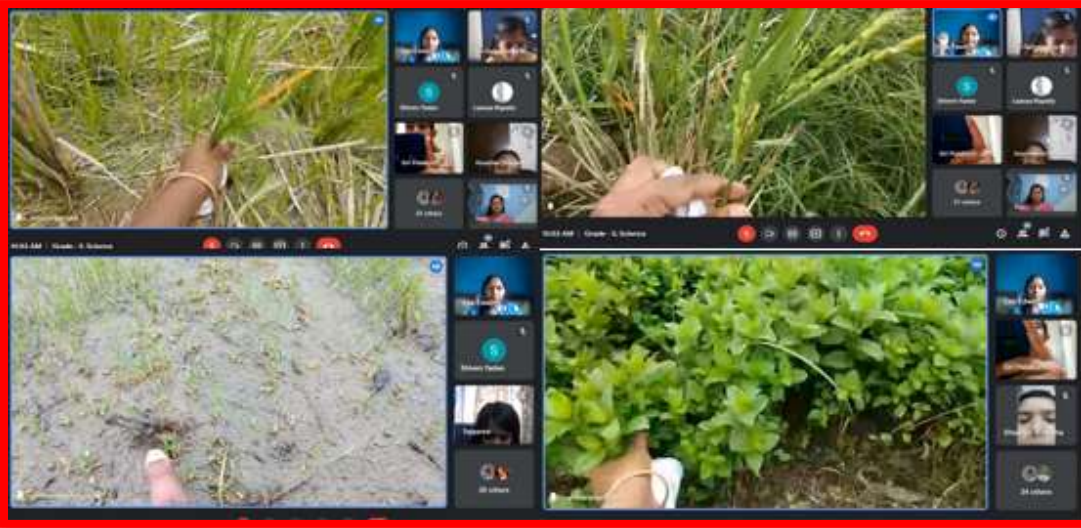

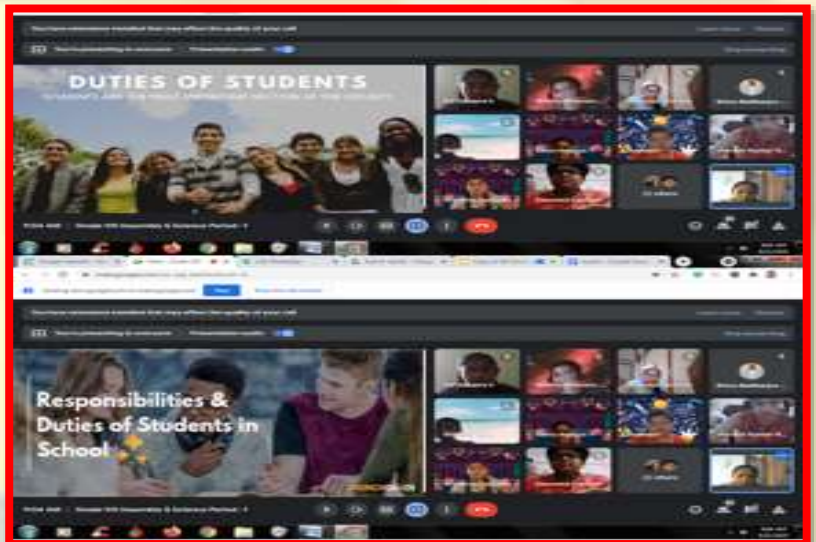
Assembly Presentation by Grade VIII Topic: Important duties of a student

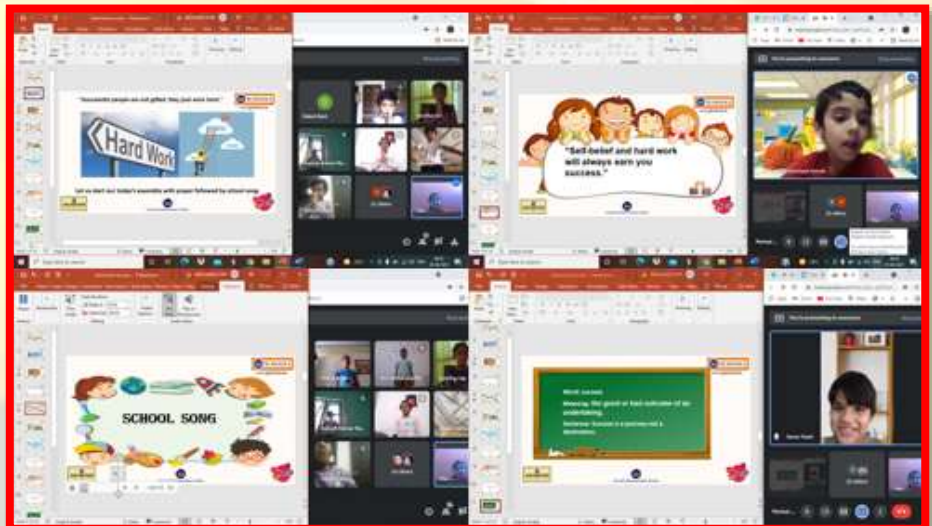
Assembly Presentation by Grade I Topic: Hard Work-A ladder to success

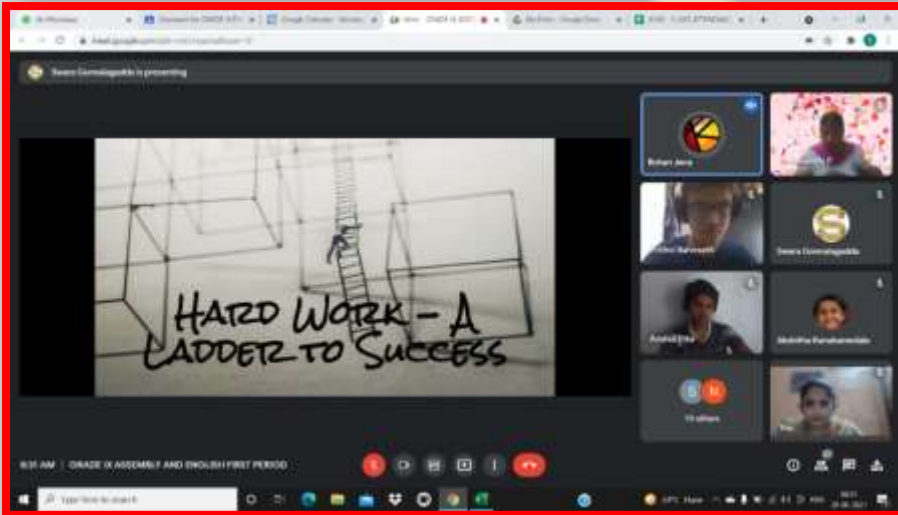

Limit social media. Too much social media wastes time and can be a source of stress or uncertainty.

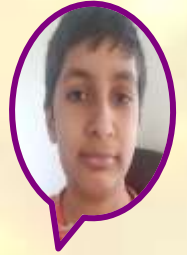
Break up learning into chunks of time. Try to finish your work when school would be over for the day. After "school hours", do something fun and relaxing.
