





Virtual Exam in JHCS Kondapur

For many students around the world, the end of the school year is associated with high-stakes examinations. These are often used to select or certify students as they move from one level of the education system to the next. In general, examinations are used to make decisions about an individual student's progress through the education system, including the allocation of educational opportunities.



With the coronavirus forcing school closures and bans on group gatherings, taking exams on school premises became difficult. This necessitated our school to innovate and use digital means of conducting the examination. The students and teachers have been using the same means to conduct tests and assessments throughout the year. So, when the time came for conducting the final exams the teachers were ready with skills to create digital forms for the question papers, and students were equipped to take the exams using mobile devices, tablets, or laptops.

At the end of the academic year, Virtual Term assessment - II was conducted smoothly in JHCS Kondapur from Grade I to VII from 8th March to 19th March.

Technology nowadays is the center of our life. It constantly influences our life and decisions and is crucial to our learning experience. Google's virtual platform was used for conducting the examination. All the students of Grades I to VII attempted the exam online. The final virtual online exam included questions of both- objective and subjective type, testing students' abilities. Parents also played the crucial role in helping the students with technical issues of uploading the scanned images or PDF files. With the preparedness from all stakeholders -teachers, students, and parents the exams were conducted smoothly for all the classes.

Reminiscence 2020-2021



Parent-teacher meetings are a great way for parents and teachers to bond and cooperate with the sole intention of bettering the children. With more and more of our daily communication taking place digitally rather than face to face, the PTM has also taken a leap and embraced the virtual platform.

PTMs are important to keep parents informed about their child's

progress, their child's performance at academics, and at the same time, help the teachers understand the child and help them improve in case they are lacking in any department. As JHCS, Kondapur held the online PTM for the session 2020-21, for the classes I to VII, the school was delighted to witness the synergy between parents and teachers making it a success. Virtual PTM has helped teachers and parents connect virtually to engage in a transparent and open discussion for the children's better future.

The class teachers of Grades I-VII successfully conducted a virtual P.T.M. on 27.03.2021, for their respective classes, interacting with parents. The teachers made use of the digital application, Google Meet to interact with parents via video call. Main points discussed were:

- 1. Parents were assured that there are sincere efforts taken by the school and the teachers in providing quality education to the children, thereby looking forward to the betterment of the child.
- 2. Parents were requested to ensure that their ward keeps up with and regularly attends the online classes and practices the study material that is sent on a regular basis. Many points related to how the student can manage his/her time effectively and can ensure steady learning in the given situation, were also discussed.
- 3. Parents were advised to motivate the child to practice continuous writing as well, to make sure that the student does not lose touch of writing, since most of the learning is being done using online tools.
- 4. Many parents raised issues of network and problems of connectivity during classes due to which the child sometimes misses out on the topic being done. They were assured that the child can contact the concerned teacher for clearing his/her doubts, and can also refer to the study material that is sent to support the topic covered in online classes.
- 5. Feedbacks from the parents were taken about the overall session (2020-21) and assured that the same would be taken care of.
- 6. Furthermore, achievements of the students were also presented and discussed regarding their progress in both scholastic and non-scholastic areas.
- 7. Report cards were sent across to the respective students after the PTM.




