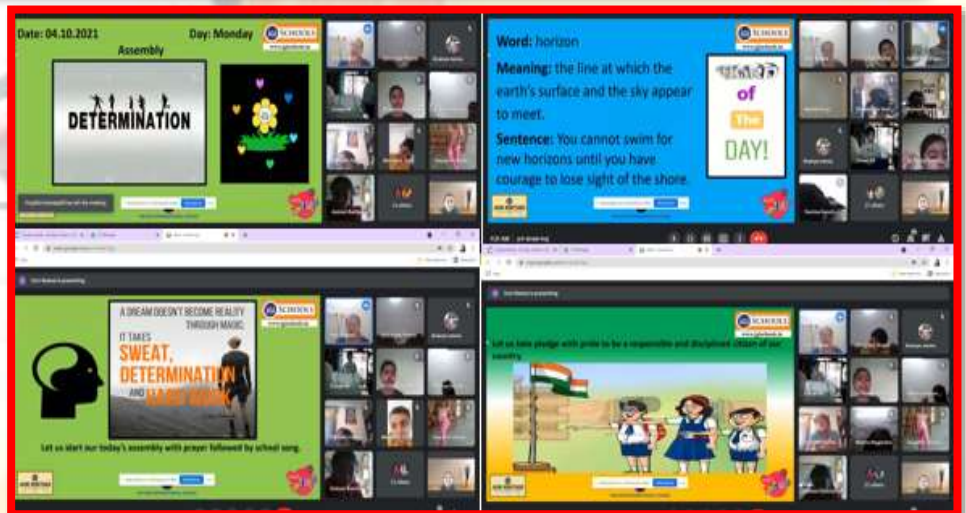
## Assembly Presentation by Grade II Topic: Determination

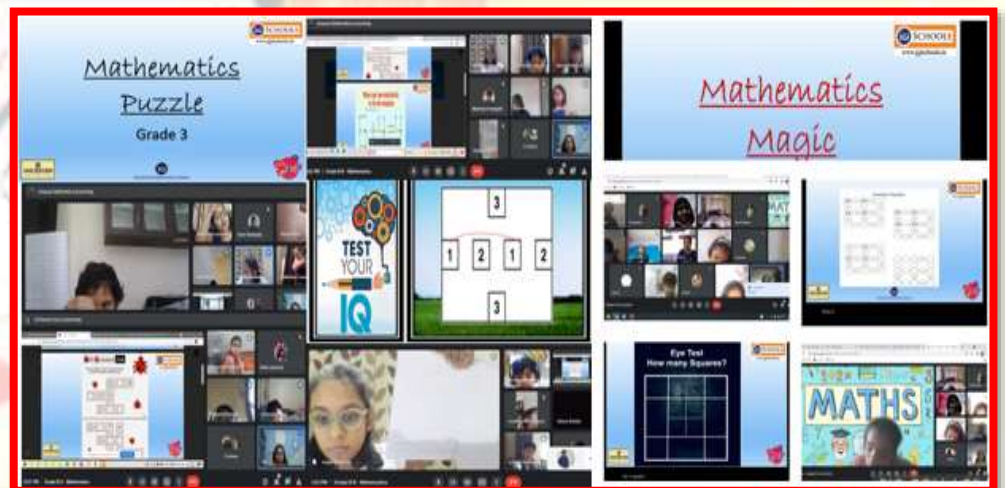
## Mathematics Puzzle Competition for Grade III & VI

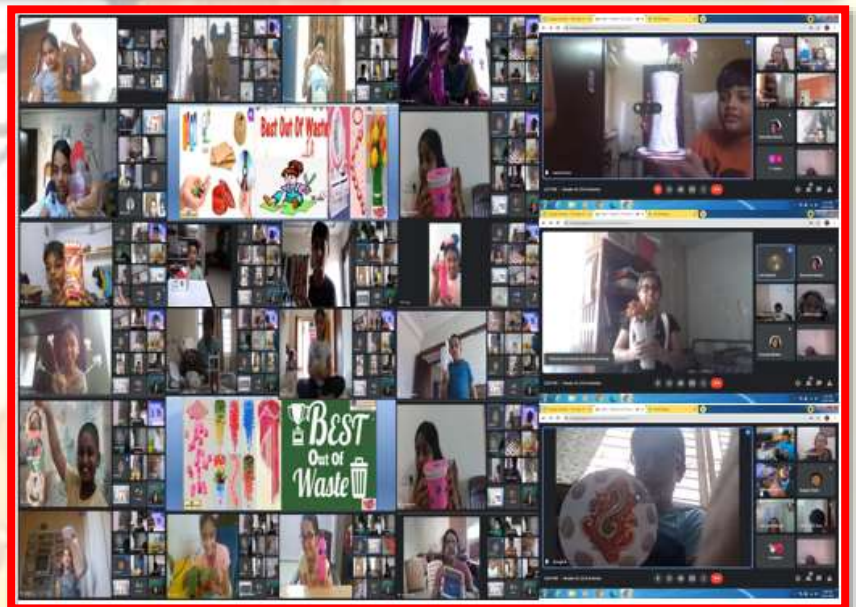
## Best out of Waste Competition for Grade IV & V

Origami is an activity that involves the art of folding paper with certain techniques to make something new. This activity triggers the child’s imagination and enhances the creative skills.

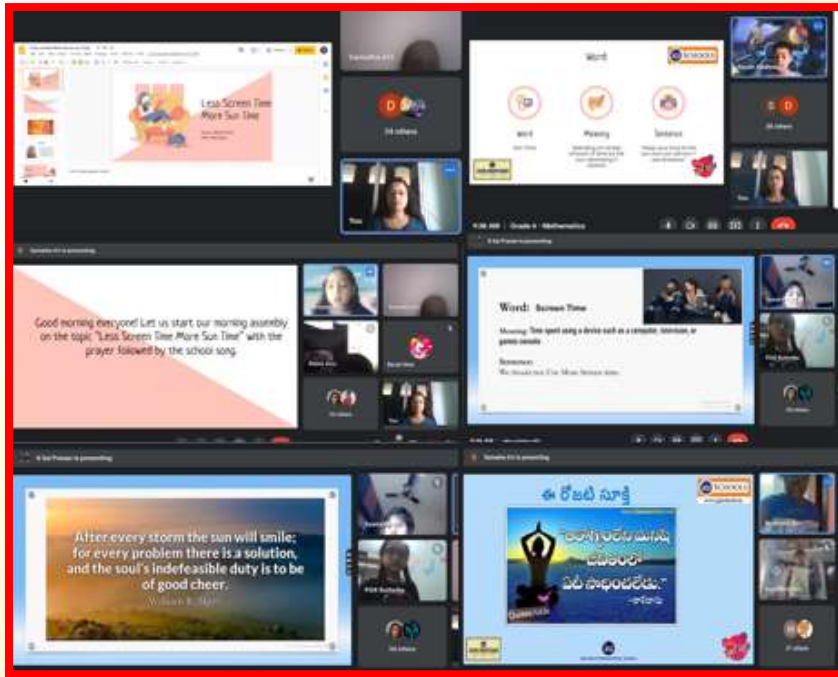
JHCS KP conducted

## Our Alumni Speaks...

What is Working Capital Management and why is it important in day-to-day business?

Working Capital Management (WCM) involves the relationship between the company's current assets and current liabilities which ensures that the firm can operate efficiently by satisfying short-term debt and expenses. There are three reasons why firms maintain a certain amount of cash reserves, for speculation, for precaution, and for the transaction. Holding cash in a speculative market will give companies an advantage when prices drop significantly, it will help the company to buy raw materials and other goods at low prices. It is always good for any company to maintain a contingency cash reserve for emergency situations and unforeseen crises. The most important reason for holding cash is to meet day to day expenses of the company and clear off small debts.



An important concept of WCM is the Operating Cycle. Operating Cycle describes the amount of time taken for the raw materials to be converted into finished goods and then selling the goods to final consumers and receiving payment for such sales. An operating cycle is said to be complete when the company after producing goods, sells its products, and receives payment in exchange for goods with the final customer, then one operating cycle is said to be complete. The operating cycle of a firm is computed as the number of days it takes to complete one cycle. The operating cycle for any firm in any industry involves raw material storage period, work in process period, finished goods period, collection period, net operating cycle time, and gross operating cycle time.
