Teachers play a major role in making their students responsible citizens of tomorrow and good human beings. It is impossible to imagine our lives without teachers.




Ganesh Idol Making Activity for Grade I to VII



The day aims to enhance knowledge about the disease and is observed in many countries. Rabies is a zoonotic disease that is transmitted from animals to humans. It is caused by the rabies virus that originates from the Lyssavirus genus of the Rhabdoviridae family.

As the rabies landscape has changed, World Rabies Day remains a general day of awareness but has also become an integral part of national, regional, and global rabies elimination strategies. In the JHCS KP calendar celebration of World Rabies Day is a regular feature, and this year on September 27th, we had an assembly conducted on this topic. This year's theme for World Rabies Day is: "Rabies: Facts, not Fear" based on ending the fear from the people and empowering them with the facts. The aim was to recognise that the health of people is connected to the health of animals and the environment. BOOK REVIEW: HEIDI



