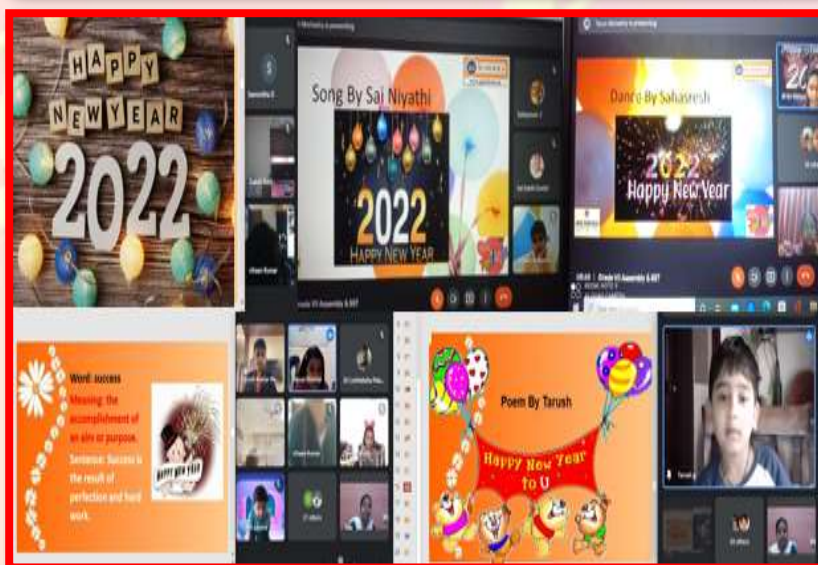

It’s a new year, which means you have goal setting on your mind to create a new, better you!

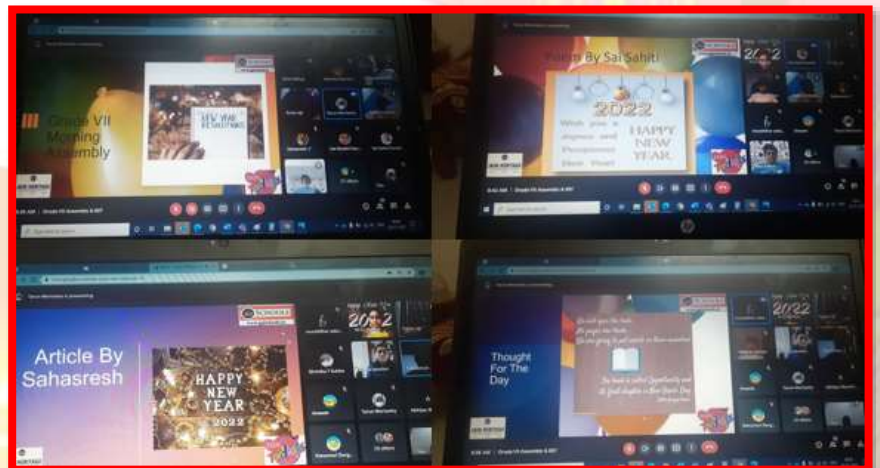

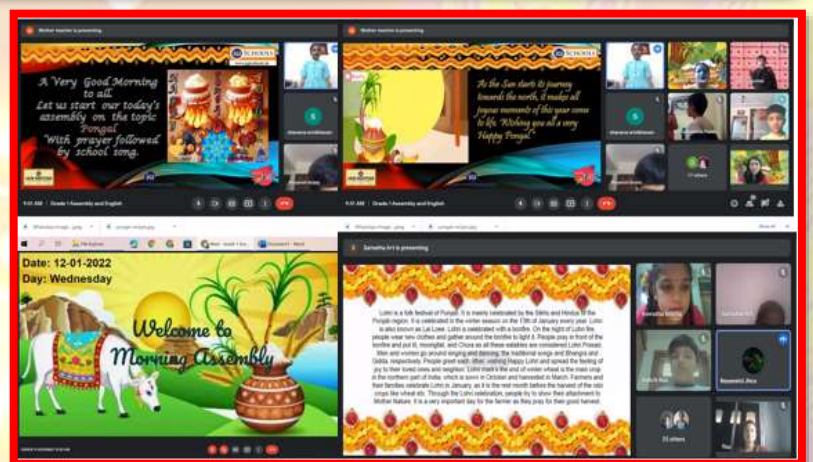

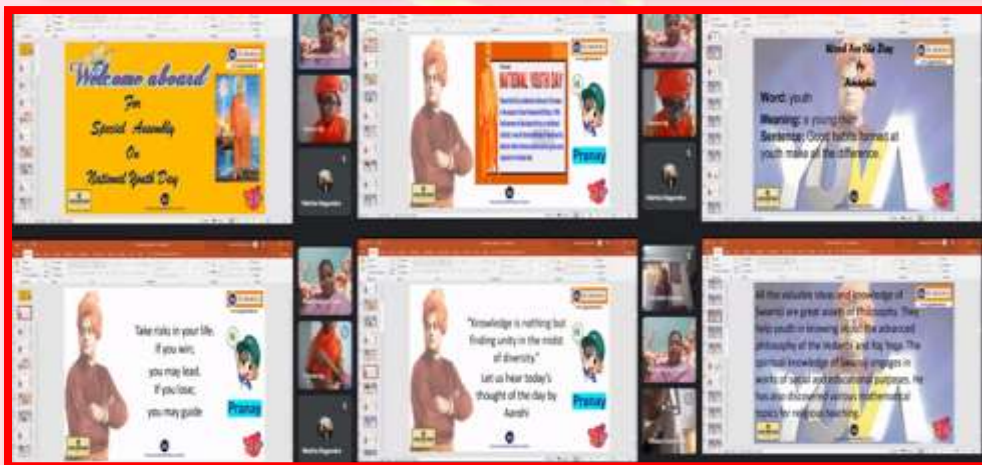

Makar Sankranti Celebration

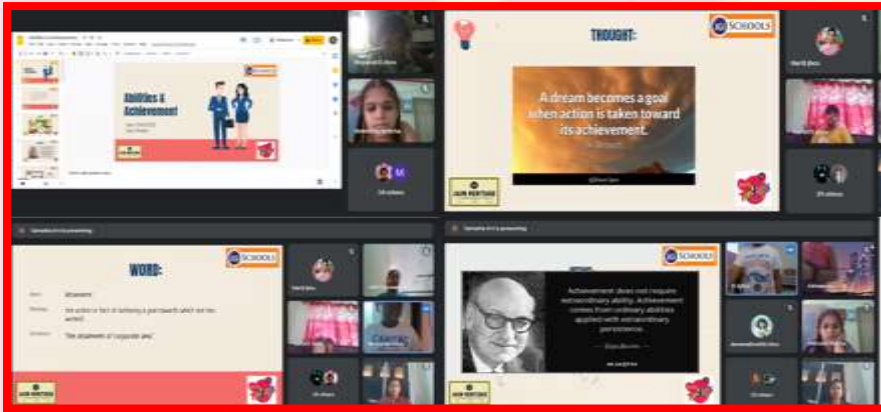

Special Assembly Presentation on Lala Lajpat Rai birth anniversary by Grade VI

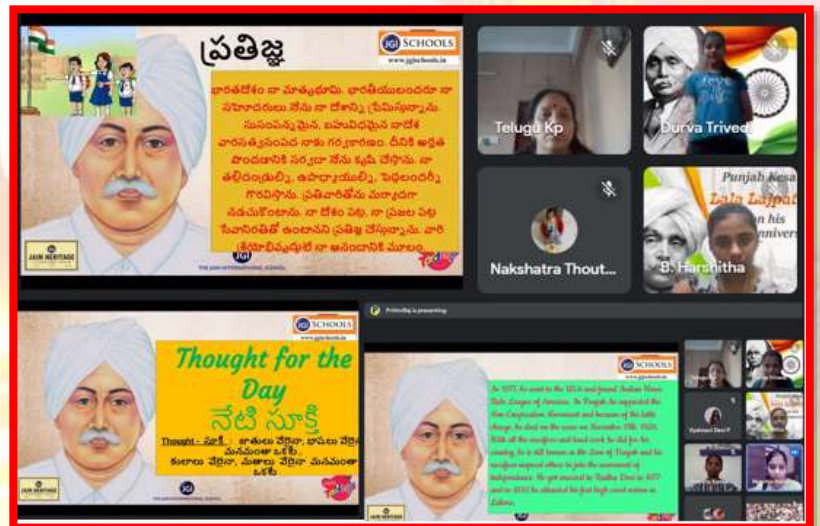

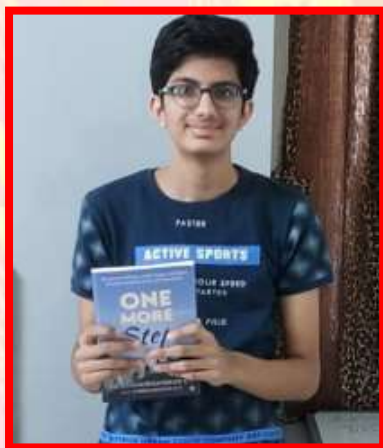
