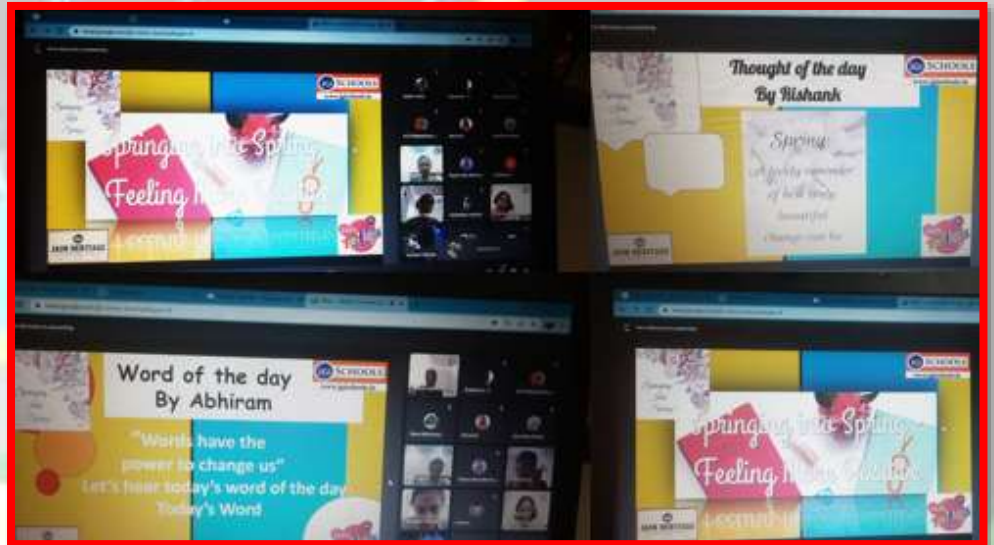

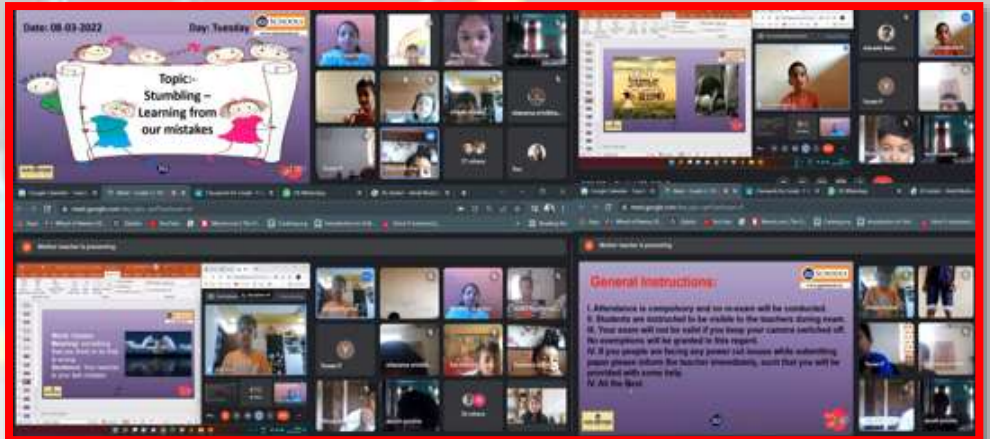

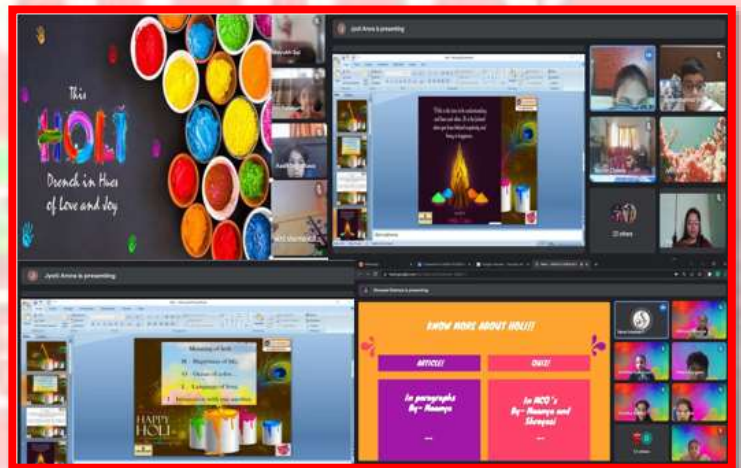
Holi Celebration
