Field Trip of Grade VI to VIII Place: Pochampally



"If you never go, you'll never know!"

On 4th of November 2022, students of Grades VI, VII and VIII went on a field trip to Pochampally We visited the Pochampally Chenetha Kala Kendram Weaving Museum, where we got to know a lot of information and new facts about the art of weaving. The museum was surrounded by energetic monkeys. We were enlightened with information about Acharya Vinobha Bhaave, an Indian advocate of non-violence and human rights. It all started when he got to know about the poor state of the civilians. He initiated the Bhoodan (land gift) movement started at Pochampally on 18 April 1951. He walked all across India asking people with land to consider him one of their sons and so to give him one-sixth of their land which he then distributed to landless poor. In this way 100 acres of land was donated to the needy. In

1971, they started exporting Pattu Cheera from Pochampally all the way to America. The walls of the museum displayed the various processes of weaving, and the concentration weavers had when they wove. We learnt about lkkat, a traditional textile that is woven using hand dyed silk or cotton yarn. We saw different designs of weaving like Silk Teliya Mamidi Pandu design, double ikkat, warp ikkat, gollabhama and telia rumal. We saw something really interesting called gadwall sari. A gadwall sari is a mix of cotton and silk, where the entire drape is made of cotton and the border is made of silk. We saw the mechanism of pit looms, frame looms and power looms. We heard about the Integrated Handloom Cluster Development Scheme (IHCDS). It works to up-grade skills of weavers to produce diversified products with improved quality, to provide suitable workplace to improve productivity, and to provide any other basic needs to weavers. We saw weaves that had designs of national leaders like Gandhiji, Indira Gandhi and Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan. We also interviewed a family of weavers. The sarees that they weave are sold for 40,000 Rs in malls and shops, but all that they earn is 10,000 Rs. Not to mention that a simple lkkat saree takes approximately 4 days to weave. The average income of a cotton weaver is rs 8500 per month and 12500 for silk weavers. The family had a pit loom in their house. They had made a beautiful peacock themed weave which was kept on display. We interviewed Mr. Madhu, a weaver. He told us that weaving was not a white-collar job. It required hard work and patience. Mr. Madhu's family stated that the government supported them and gave them loans when required. We then ate lunch and boarded the bus back to school at 12:55 pm. We reached back at 3:00pm, and boarded the buses again to go home. We were accompanied by our lovely teachers, Kavitha R mam, Mary mam, Anunidhi mam, Jyothi mam, Vatsala mam and Koti Sir. I would like to thank Shuchita mam, Kavitha R mam and our beloved Principal Dr. Mona Mehdi madam for organizing such a wonderful trip, which we all immensely enjoyed.

The B. M. Birla Science Museum is an Indian science museum located in Hyderabad. Constructed by civil engineer P. A. Singaravelu, it comprises a planetarium, museum, science centre, art gallery as well as a dinosaurium. An educational field trip was organised for the grades IX and X on the 7th of November. After fulfilling our curiosity in this section, we went to the archaeological gallery. Over here, we spent about 30 minutes learning a lot about Indian and European mythologies and craftsmanship. We proceeded to the upper floor and saw the electronic exhibits, a miniature nuclear plant and multiple other interactive video activities. We then continued our trip to the space exhibit where we were amazed by the Indian rockets, missiles and satellites such as the PSLV and GSLV. We also observed the international space station model and remote images of states of India. Successively we entered the dinosaurium where we saw archaeological finds of 160-million-year-old trees and fossils such as ammonite and massive dinosaur skeleton the Kotasaurus and the evolution of humans.

STARS with MASK




Certain scenes were written particularly well, for instance, the sad scenes.


