When we talk about great personalities, we are not necessarily talking about rich and famous people. There are plenty of personalities who have done great service to their country and society at large, without being popular or rich.

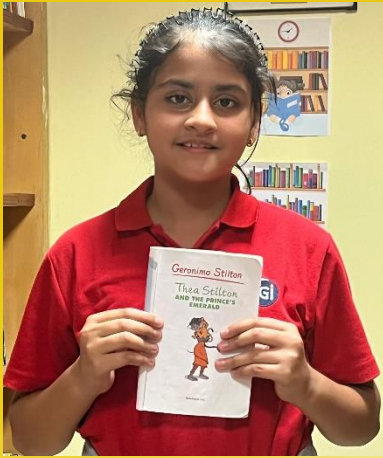
