He set fire to his harvested rice to get the attention of villagers near the coast and guide them to high ground in the darkness. The 1854 tsunami caused damage and casualties, but his actions saved many in Hiro. It became part of Japanese folklore. This inspiring story is a reminder that common people who are informed and aware, can make a big difference. The assembly concluded with the singing of the national anthem.

Field Trip to Dr Reddy's Institute of Life Sciences (DRILS) for Grade IX & X



"The best education happens beyond the classroom."

It was euphoric day. On Tuesday, November 7, 2023, students from Grades IX and X of Jain Heritage a Cambridge School were taken on a field trip to Dr Reddy's Institute of Life Sciences (DRILS) at the Hyderabad Central University Campus (HCU). Dr. Pallavi, one of the professors who guided us throughout the trip, greeted us. The students were divided into four groups, each led by a teacher or a volunteer. Dr. Tanuja, Research Manager, and Dr. Tanvika, Associate Principal Investigator, were introduced to the students in the "Harvard" classroom first. Dr. Tanuja gave us an overview of the institute, and Dr. Tanvika gave a brief presentation on NAFLD (Non-Alcoholic Fatty Liver Disease) and her research on it, the students asked

doubts and had a great time interacting with the Professors. Later, a PPT presentation was presented by Ms.

Shruti on computational Chemistry where students learned about how computers and mathematical algorithms based on Maxwell Boltzmann Law are used to explain and depict chemical phenomena using simulations and were shown some as examples.

Subsequently, school apprentices visited at different laboratories of the institute where various PhD scholars who

are engaged in doing intensive research on diverse topics.

School students learned about DNA Amplification, Autoclaving,
Gene Transcription, Cell Cultures, Rare Diseases, Toxicology,
Protein Bonding and observed lab equipment's, Apparatuses,
Live Zebra fish models and cell models and imagery. The school
children also got chance, in conducting a Thin Layer
Chromatography (TLC) practical, and also shared light hearted
jokes during the procedure. Finally, the students were shown a
pilot plant which is used for low volume production of active
pharmaceutical ingredients and were bid farewell. The
experience was of a life time. The children were inspired by the
researchers and their dedication towards their work on
improvement in medicine and cures for different disease. As

CCA - Diva Making Competition for Grade I to V


