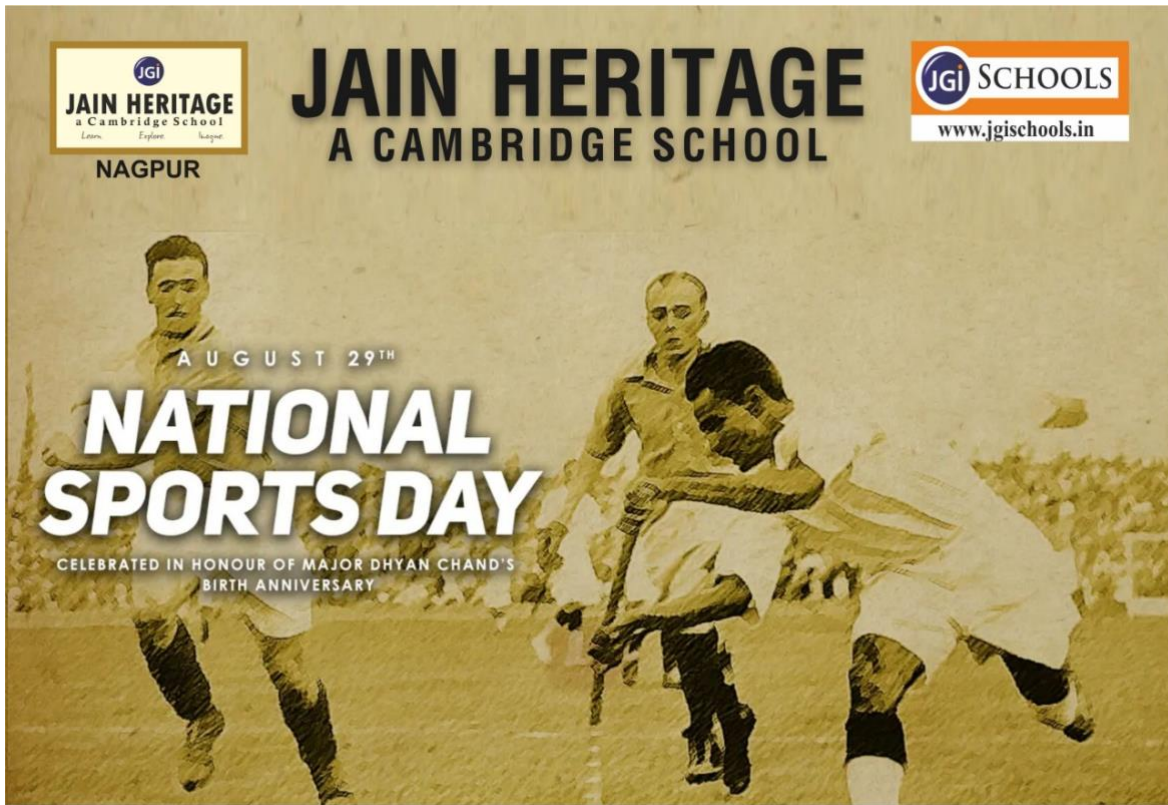


Inter House Flower Decoration Competition

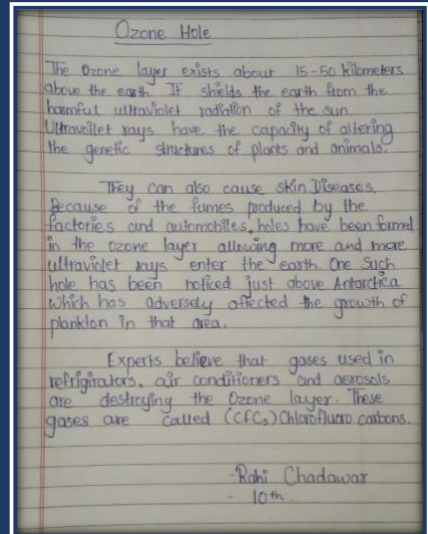
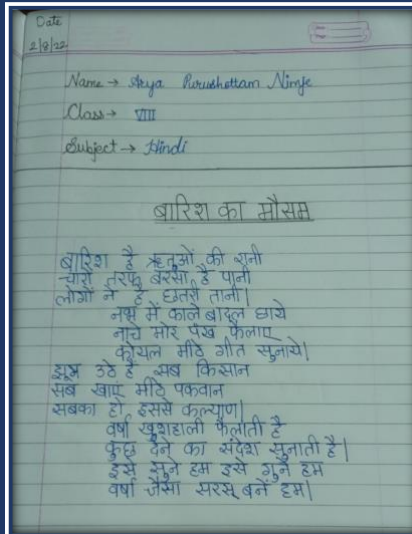
The Ride

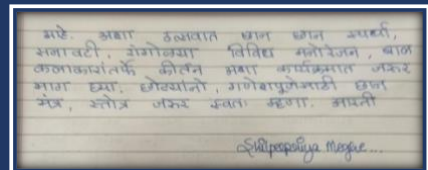
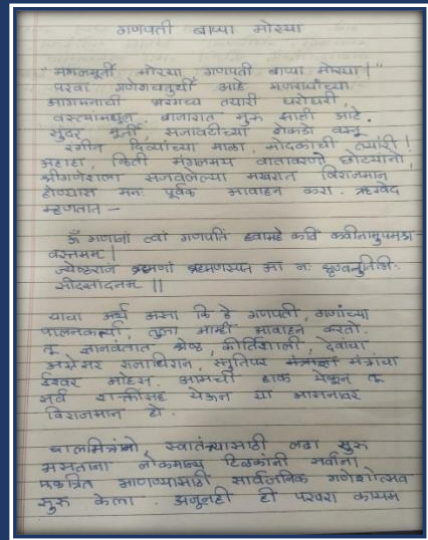
- The Sun constitutes more than 99 percent of the total mass of the Solar System.
