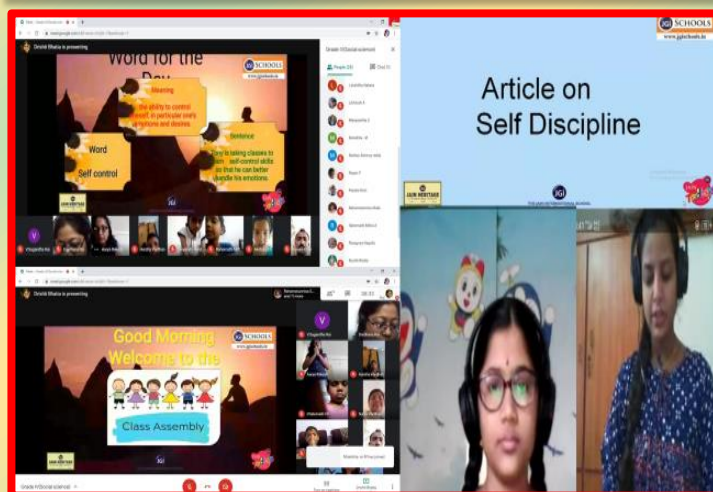

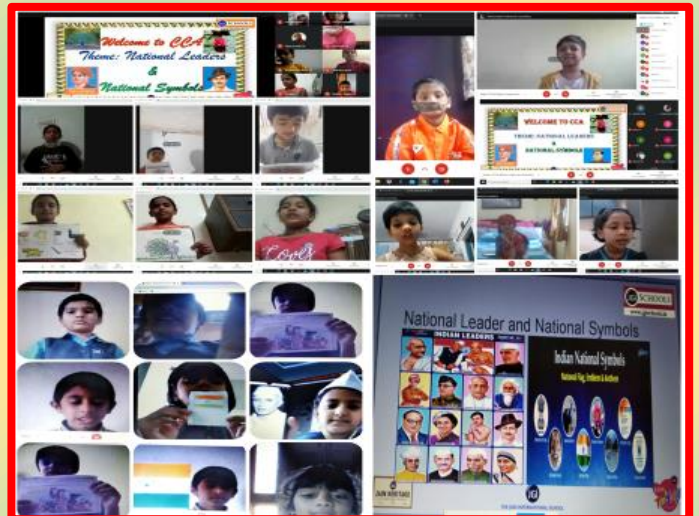
## Speech Competition for Grades I-V

## Eco-Friendly Ganesha making Competition for Grades VI-X

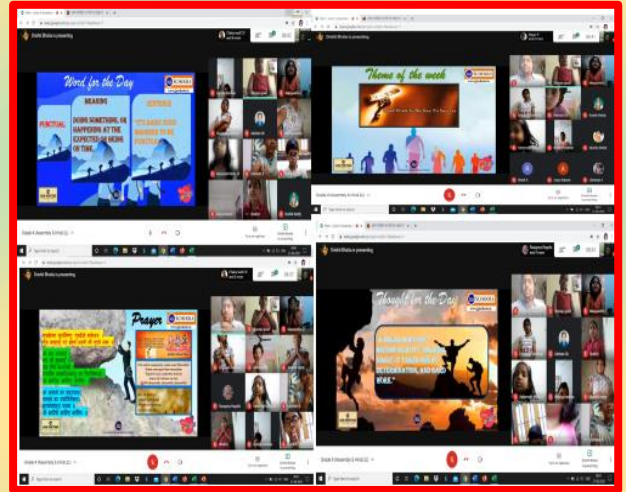
