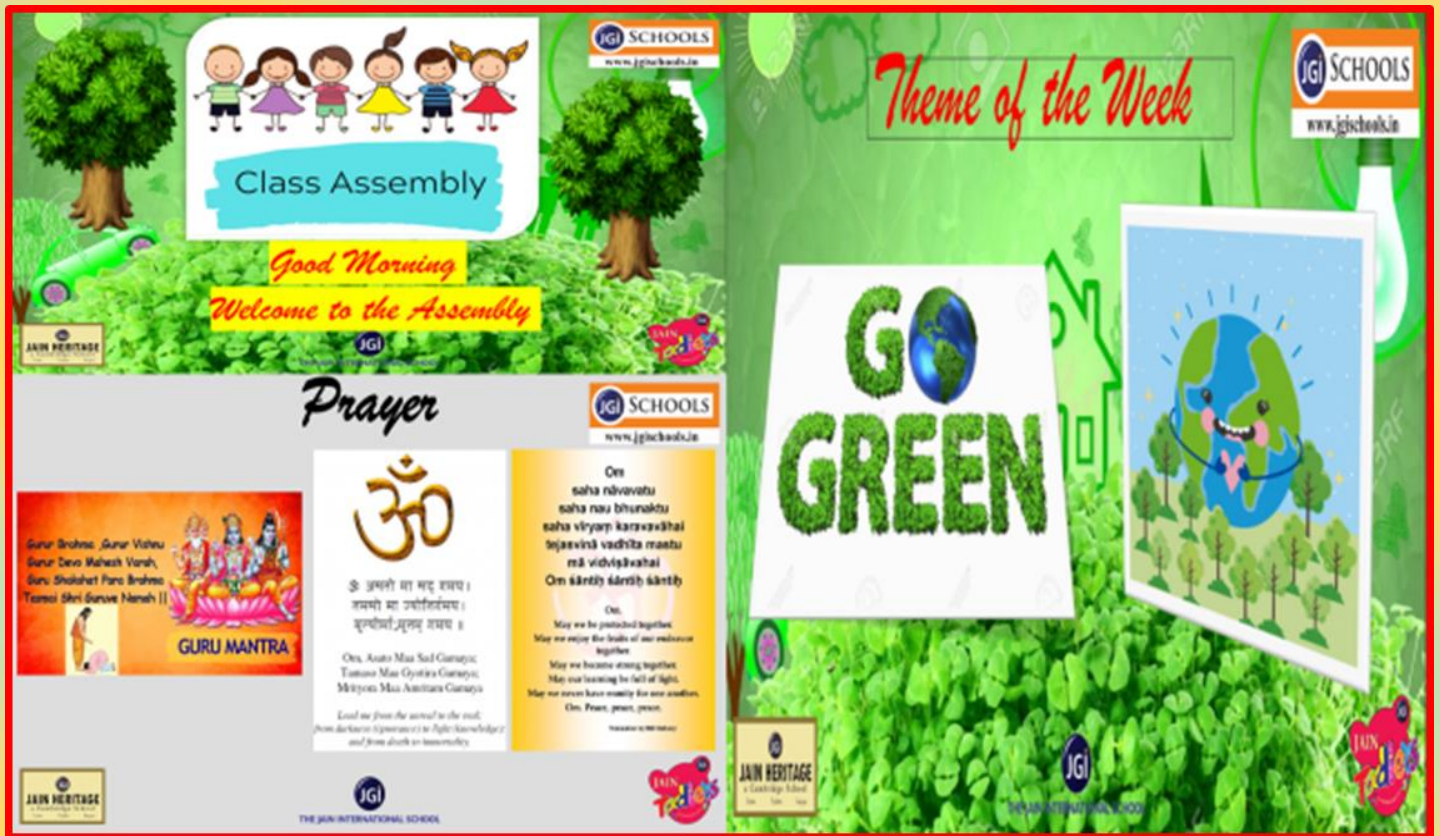
SHOW and TELL

“Plants are green and without them the Earth wouldn't be such a lovely home for human beings.”

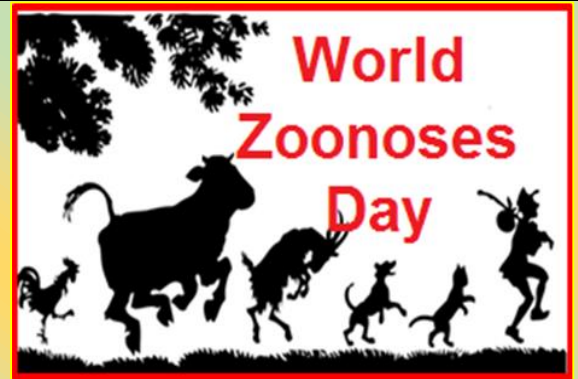

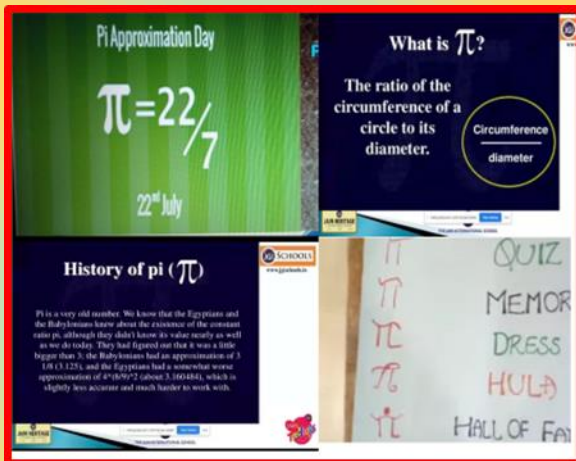




“Cleanliness is next to Godliness.”

Children introduced themselves by saying their name, age, school and their date of birth and introduced the names of their family members and their relation with them. It was really a wonderful learning experience to every toddler.

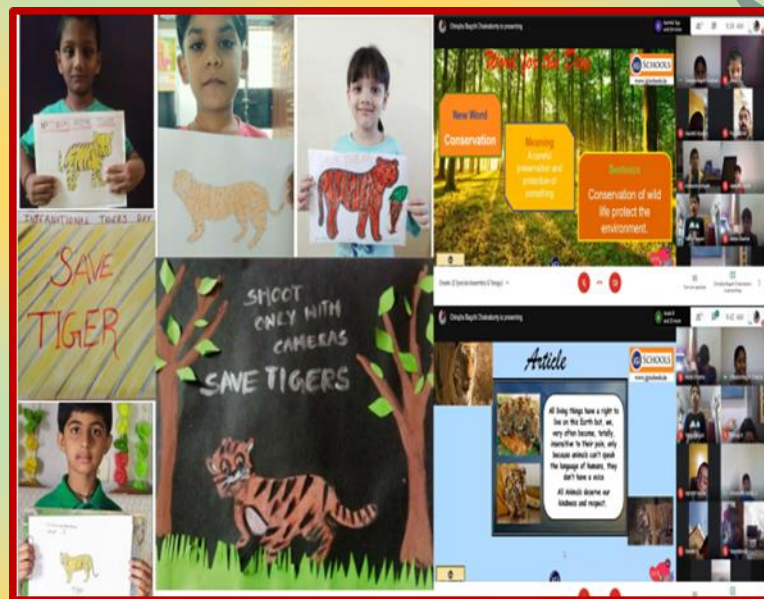

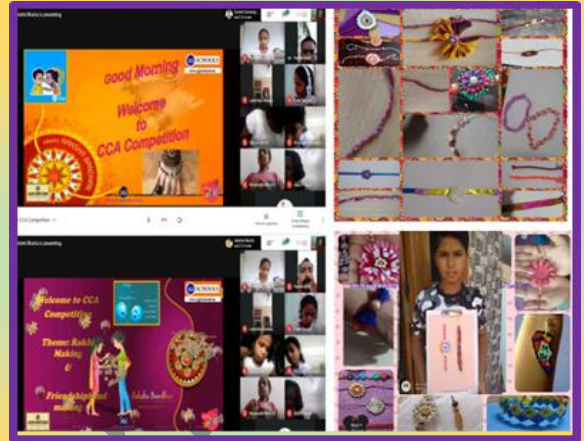
