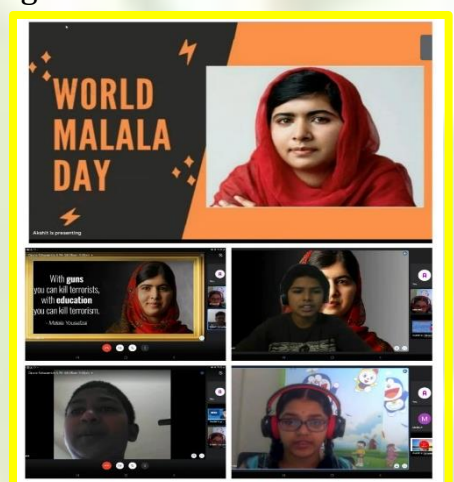

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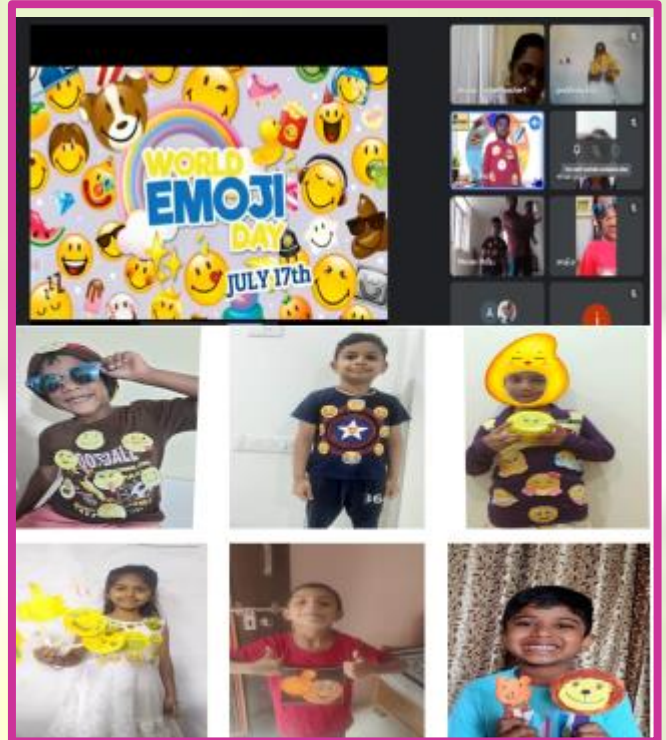

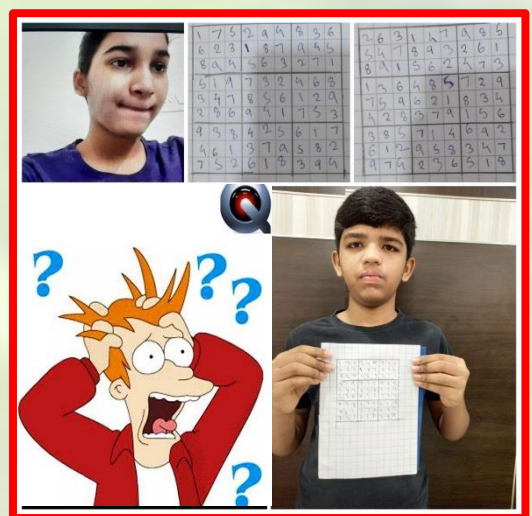

में विजय हासिल की थी। कारगिल युद्ध कुल 60 दिन चला था। करीब 18 हजार फीट की ऊँचाई पर कारगिल में लड़ी गई इस जंग में देश ने लगभग 527 से ज्यादा वीर योद्धाओं को खोया था, वहीं 1300 से ज्यादा घायल। कारगिल युद्ध में भारतीय जवानों ने पाकिस्तानियों को धूल चटा दिया था। उनकी नापाक कोशिशों पर पानी फिर गया। पाकिस्तानी सैनिकों ने जिहादियों को फ्रंट बनाकर आगे किया था। उनके सैनिकों ने पूरी योजना बनाई। पाकिस्तानी सैनिकों ने जगह-जगह पोजिशन ले रखी थी। लेकिन हमारे जवानों ने उनके सैनिकों को ढेर कर दिए थे। युद्ध में २७०० पाकिस्तानी सैनिक मारे गए और २५० पाकिस्तानी सैनिक जंग छोड़ के भाग गए। 26 जुलाई 1999 को भारत ने कारगिल युद्ध में विजय हासिल की थी। इस प्रकार हमारे विद्यालय के छात्र कारगिल दिवस मनाएं और इसी प्रकार विजय हासिल करने की प्रेरणा भी प्राप्त की। **“कभी -कभी शांति के लिए भी युद्ध करना पड़ता है।”**

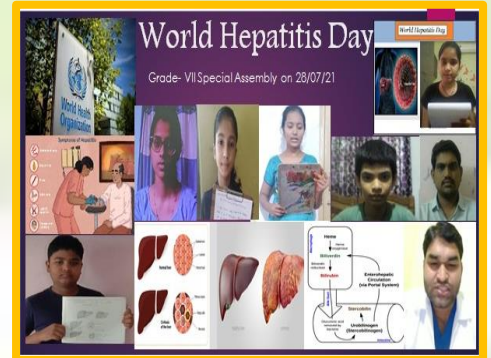

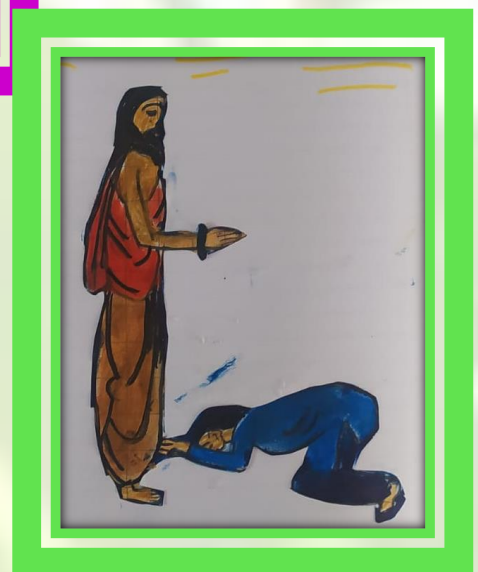
