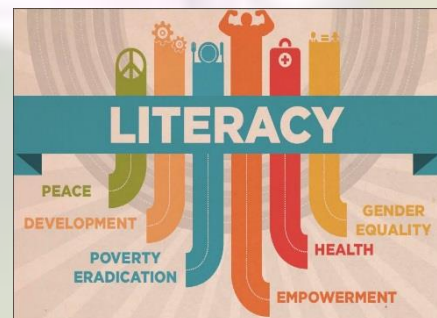

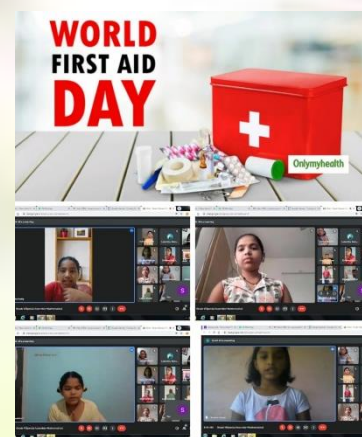

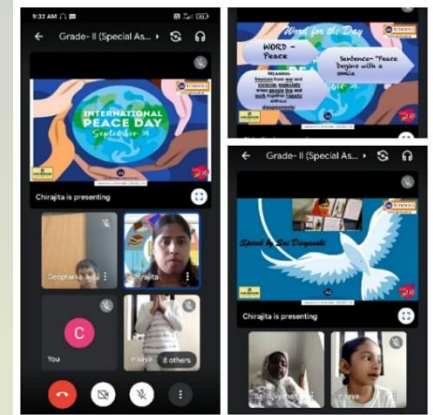
## Special Assembly presentation On “International Day of Peace”

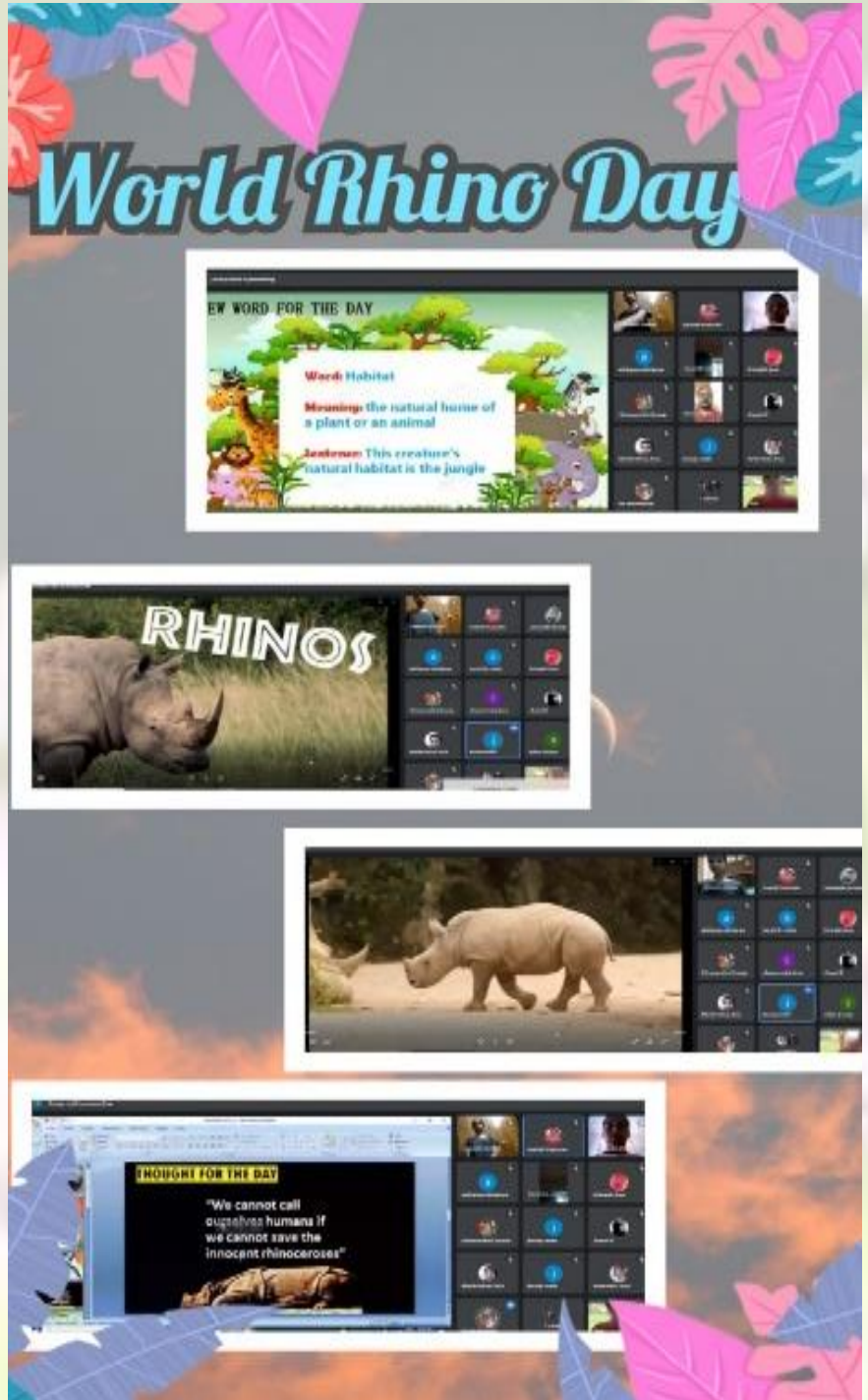


