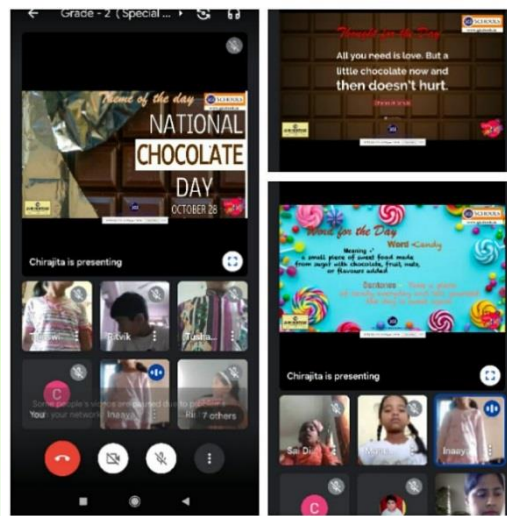

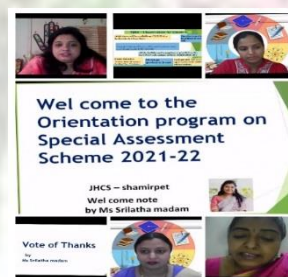

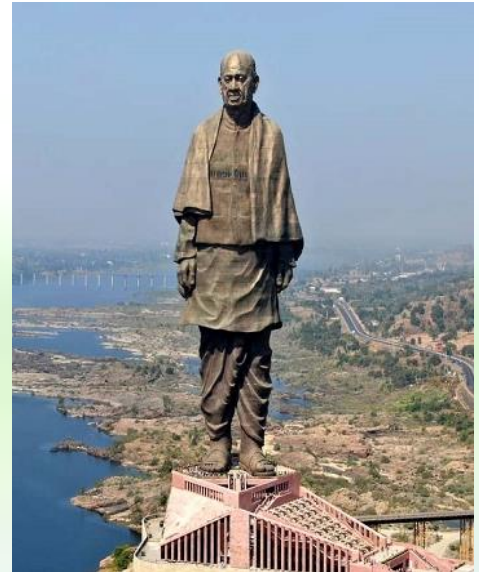
Special Assembly Presentation on National Unity Day

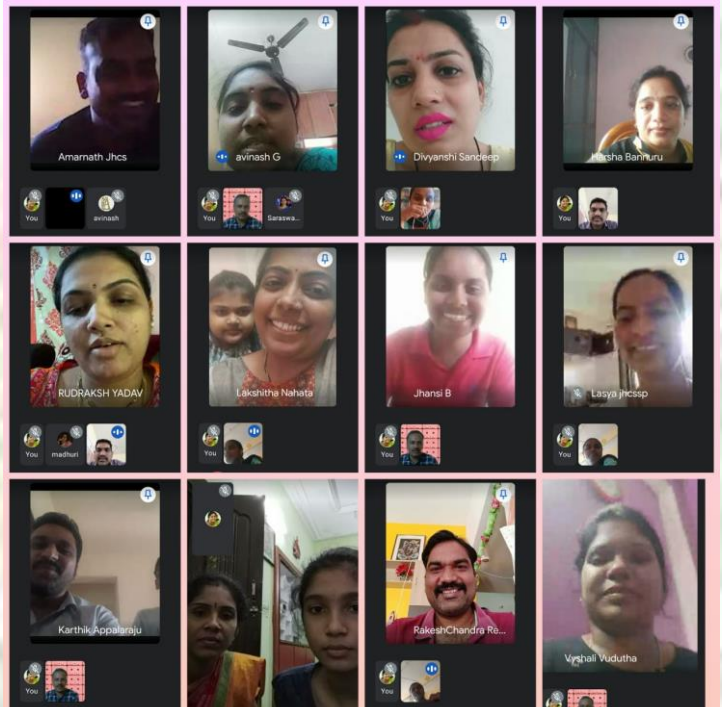

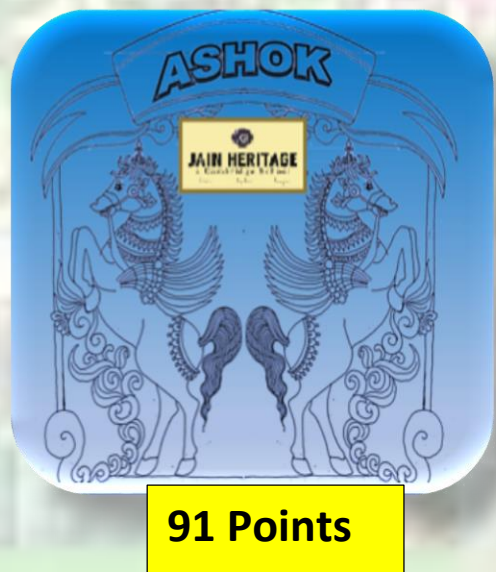

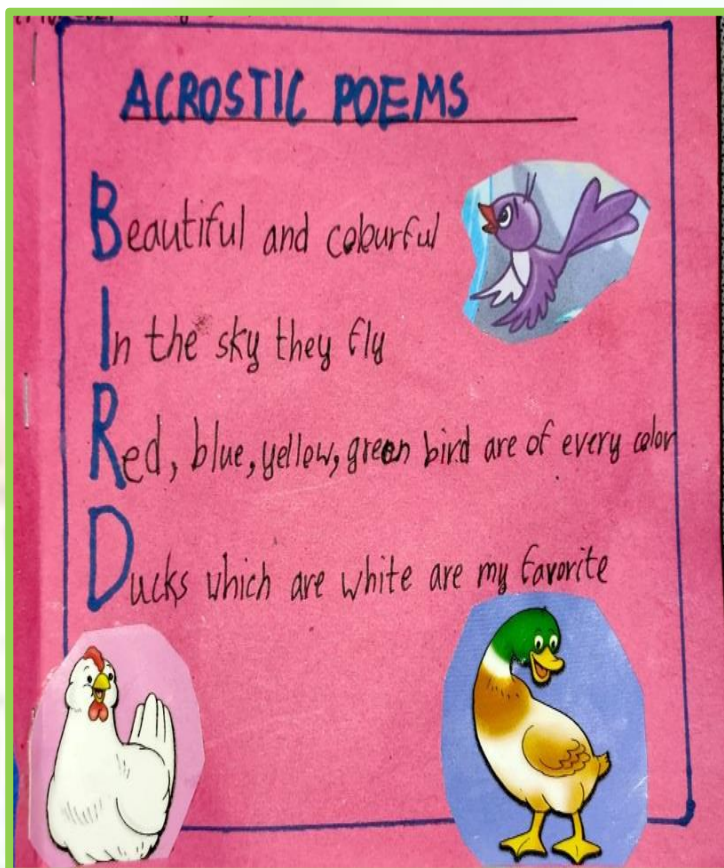
Maggie, Coco and Dojo

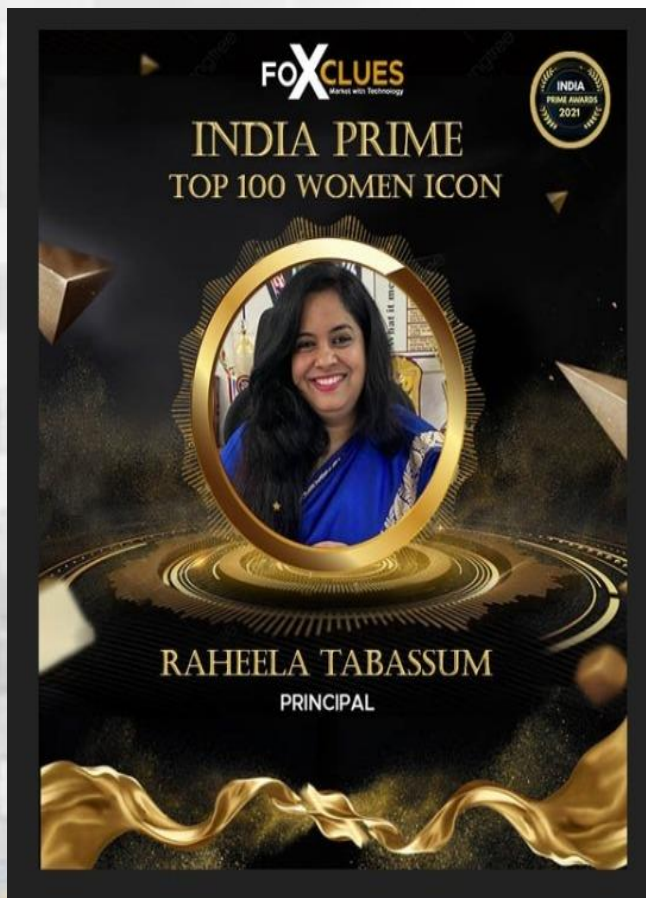
